



Learning About Rocks (Science Builders) by Mari Schuh

Facts about rocks. Aimed at 1st grade. Mentions rocks, minerals, fossils and layers of earth. Reviewers liked it.




Rocks: Hard, Soft, Smooth, and Rough (Amazing Science) by Natalie M. Rosinsky


A Rock Is Lively (Nature Books) by Dianna Hutts Aston

Fossils Tell of Long Ago (Let's-Read-And-Find-Out Science 2) by Aliki

Aimed at Level 2 but reviews say preschoolers liked it. Describes how fossils were formed and what life on Earth was like long ago. Includes a glossary and an activity guide for children to create their own fossils for someone to find in the distant future. Nice illustrations.
