Purpose

The purpose of this degree program is to expose the student to comprehensive outlook of Theology as well as equipping the student with ministry tools and abilities to be more effective and boisterous in ministry. The program also prepares the candidate to lunch in good Essay writing and to help the candidate produce comprehensive Theological work towards ministry and academic work.

Degree Requirements

The Bachelor of Theology program requires 90 units. Meaning that the student is required to submit 18 assignments and follow course work procedure to accomplish his or her program successfully. That is, 5 units multiplied by 18, gives the student 90 units in total hours needed to graduate. Transfer of credits is not allowed. All courses must be completed at Winning Life Theological Seminary.

The program requires a High School degree with CAHSEE or a GED. If the student is able to submit one course work every FOUR Weeks, then the student can graduate at the end of two years after enrollment.

COURSES:

A Student must submit a minimum of a-10-page assignment with references, and bibliography.

<u>BTS 100:</u> Examine five communicable attributes of God and relate their effectiveness to your ministry. Examples are (I) The wisdom of God (ii) The veracity of God (iii) the goodness of God (iv) The love of God (v) the holiness of God (vi) the righteousness of God (vii) the sovereignty of God.

BTS 120: (A) Discuss the incommunicable attributes of God- (I) The independence of God (ii) immutability of God (iii) infinity of God (iv) Simplicity of God (v) immensity of God (vi) Spirituality of God.

BTS 130: Define and explain the terms "messiah", "Christ", "Lord", "Savior", "I am the light of the World", "I am the good shepherd." Student must refer to published systematic Theology books to earn a good grade.

BTS 140: Discuss the miracles of Jesus in the synoptic Gospels and relate your work to the 21st century ministry. Candidate must refer to systematic Theology books to earn a good grade.

BTS 150: Discuss the role of women in the ministry of Jesus Christ and dilate on Lukan theology on the significance of women in ministry. Refer to "The Kingdom of God and its implication to the 21st Century believers", by Dr. Dominic Adua Nyaaba.

BTS 160: Define different leadership theories in the twentieth and the twenty-First Century and dilate on the leadership style of Jesus when he "calls", "when he gives"; and the leadership style of Peter and the elders in the Ephesian Church.

BTS 180: Discuss the work of the Holy Spirit in the Bible. The student must use published systematic Theology books to complete this course.

BTS 190: Discuss the significance of the marriage institution in the Bible and dwell on "definition of Christian marriage", "companionship", "replenish and fill the earth", "keeping the marriage bed pure", "the Mystery of Marriage: Christ and His Bride", "The husband is the head", "husband must love his wife, and the wife must be submissive to her husband", and finally, "God hates divorce."

BTS 200: Elucidate Biblical and Theological Foundation of **pastoral care and s**eriously consider the following:

- a) Pastor as the shepherd (1 Peter 1-11)
- **b)** Pastor as the watchman (Heb. 13:15-17)
- c) Pastor as overseer (Acts 20: 17-35)
- d) Pastor as the spring of joy for the Church (Phil.4:1-11) (5 units)

BTS 210: THE FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Galatians 5:22-24 New International Version (NIV)

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, **23** gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

24 Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Candidate may use Greek expressions to earn extra points.

BTS 220: Discuss the first, second and third centuries persecutions against Christians AND Highlight the persecution of the following emperors:

BTS 240: Discuss the major themes in the book of Philippians. The Candidate must indicate the authorship of the book, the date of the authorship, audience, and why he penned the book.

- (b) Humility and unity, warning against evil doers
- (c) Appeal for Paul's ministry, be anxious for nothing
- (d) Support for Paul's ministry.
