What is a Hybrid School?

- <u>Combines the best attributes of on campus schooling with satellite</u> <u>schooling:</u>
 - Meet 3 days per week on campus
 - Courses incorporate a teacher knowledgeable in the subject
 - Beneficial for the increasing complexity of High School courses
 - But far less expensive than a traditional private high school
 - An existing host Church is the primary facility = major savings on real estate, utilities, etc.
 - Fewer staff, and part-time teachers as opposed to full-time
 - Curriculum is private school-based and online
 - Gives each student the resources to succeed and less burden on teachers
 - Parents are the coaches!

Tuition

- Tuition is presently estimated at \$5,200/student/year
 - Includes 5 core and 2 elective subjects
 - Core: Bible, English, Math, Science, World History, Spanish and PE
 - Access to fully online courses (additional \$295 or \$325 a course per semester)
 - Field trips and special events at additional cost
 - Does not include one time admission fee (\$100) or placement testing fee (\$75)

Tuition (Part-Time)

- Part-Time Student Tuition
 - \$1,000.00/subject (KLCA teacher-led classes)
 - Does not include admission fee (\$100) or placement testing fee (\$75)
 - If the student desires to stay on campus for the entire day there is a study hall fee for the year (\$300)
- Discounts
 - 3% discount for subsequent sibling, full-time students
 - 3% discount for full-time students of parents / legal guardians who are active military or first responders
 - (Maximum discount of 3% per full-time student)



Tuition

Payment Options

- Full payment (preferred): due with signed financial contract by June 1st
- (2) Semi-Annual payments
 - 1st payment by June 1st, and 2nd payment due in first week of 2nd semester
- Checks payable to King's Light Christian Academy, or online payments are available through ClassReach (\$50.00 setup fee)

Security & Safety

- Salem Fire and Rescue located just one mile away
- Planned and unannounced drills conducted each year based on Virginia code. At a minimum:
 - Fire (evacuation): once a week for four weeks in September, once a month thereafter
 - Shelter in Place (weather): once in October
 - Lockdown (secure the building): once in October and once in January
- Visitors will be required to show a valid ID and sign in / sign out
- All doors are locked to the outside during campus days

- Parents must be committed to providing partnership oversight in the satellite classroom on the days that the youth is not attending KLCA in order to provide quality education in accordance with existing law.

Admission Requirements, continued

- Parents and students must be committed to the university-model learning experience and Christian environment of KLCA. Each student must willingly adhere to KLCA's Student Code of Conduct, Dress Code Policy, and all other policies regarding student behavior.
- Parents must be willing to use a Christian Conciliation Service to settle any disputes if they cannot be resolved at the school level.



Statement of Faith


