Genesis 21:1-21

Review:

Read Genesis 15:1-6

- · Abraham questioned how God could make him into a great nation without any heirs.
- God showed Abraham and reminded him of His promise.
- "Abraham believed and it was credited to him as righteousness."

Read Genesis 16:1-2, 15-16

- Sarah concludes God has prevented her from conceiving (partial truth)
- Sarah's remedy is to accomplish this through Hagar.
- * Abram was 86 & had a son Ishmael with Hagar

Read Genesis 17:1-6, 15-21

- Vs. 1 "Abraham was 99 years old"
- This is 12-13 Years after Ishmael is born. He's been their only son for 13 years
- Vs. 17 Abraham can't believe that he and Sarah will have a child from their old bodies
- God tells Abraham 3 times that the covenant will be with a son from Sarah
 - Vs. 16 "I will give you a son by her...."
 - · Vs. 19 "No, Sarah your wife shall bear you a son...."
 - Vs. 21 "My covenant will be with Isaac whom Sarah will bear...."

Read Genesis 18:1, 9-14

- Abraham is 99 at this point. Sarah is 89
- God said He would return at the same time next year and they would have a son
- Vs. 11 says they were both clearly past childbearing age.
- Vs. 14 says this promised son Isaac will be born at the "appointed time"

II. God's Faithfulness to Hagar 21:8-21

God's Faithfulness to Sarah Genesis 21:1-7

Read 21:1-2

- Vs. 1a "The Lord took note of Sarah as He had said"
 - NET/ESV "visited", NIV "gracious to", NASB "Took note of"
 - · General inference to remembering, and bestowing upon Sarah
 - God remembered Sarah, He was gracious toward Sarah just as He said He would.

Vs. 1b "The Lord did for Sarah as He had promised."

- Luke 1:7 Elizabeth & Zacharias were both advanced in years and Elizabeth was barren due to age
 - Elizabeth says that "God looked with favor upon her in order to take away her disgrace among men for not being able to bear children."
 - He takes away her "DISGRACE". God's grace removes man's disgrace.
- Luke 1:30-31 Mary's Conception was likewise supernatural
 - God's covenant of a physical nation unto Himself begins with a supernatural birth
 - God's New Covenant of a spiritual nation unto Himself begins with a supernatural birth.

God Is Very Clear In His Words to Moses That Isaac Is the Promised Son Read Vs. 2-7

- 5 times in 6 verses we see a variation of Sarah "bore him a son" or "born to him".
- 4 times in 7 verses we see Isaac's name

Isaac Arrives According To ALL The Details God Promised

- Vs. 2 "Born to Abraham in old age at the appointed time, which God had spoken"
 - Gen.17:21 "Sarah will bear a son at this time next year."
 - Gen.18:10 "I will return to you at this time next year and Sarah will have a son."
 - Galatians 4:4-5 "But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, in order that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoptions as sons."
- Vs. 5 "Abraham was 100 years old"
 - Gen.17:17 "Will a child be born to a man 100 years old?"
- Vs. 3 "And Abraham called the name of his son Isaac..."
 - Gen.17:19 "....and you shall call his name Isaac and I will establish my covenant with him."
 - · Gen.17:21 "My covenant I will establish with Isaac..."
- Vs. 4 "Then Abraham circumcised his son on the 8th day just as God had commanded him."
 - Gen.17:12 "Every male among you who is 8 days old shall be circumcised....."
- · Vs. 6-7 What Once Produced Laughter of Disbelief Now Results in Laughter of Joy
 - Gen.17:17 "Abraham fell on his face and laughed in his heart regarding a son in old age."
 - · Gen.18:9-15 "......No, you definitely laughed."

Isaac = "Laughter" or "He laughs"

God Was Faithful and Gracious To Sarah

- God Blessed Her Son From Her Own Body. God promised to make her "mother of many nations"
- God promised "kings of people shall come from Sarah's lineage" God removed reproach of barrenness

When God Determines To Glorify Himself, He Will Not Share That Glory With Another

- 1. Sometimes God expects that we will regulate and police our behaviors and responses
- 2. Other Times God Makes His Glory Undeniable & Unmistakable
 - Only God can make a 90 year old woman fertile. Only God can make a virgin with child
 - Only God can walk out of a tomb 3 days later. Even the plagues (some were somewhat replicated by magicians) Then God stepped it up so there was no confusion about His glory

II. God's Faithfulness to Hagar Genesis 21:8-21

Read 21:8-21

Ishmael Is Not Mentioned By Name Anymore?

- He is only referred to as "the lad of the maid", "the son of the maid", "the boy"
- 13 times in 13 verses he's now referenced with pronouns and not his name.

Vs. 8-9 Abraham Throws a Great Celebration - But Ishmael Mocks Isaac

- Isaac probably around 2 or 3 years old. Ishmael has been the son and the focus for 16-17 years
- Ishmael Is Apparently mocking Isaac, or the feast, or the entire idea of the celebration.
- He's old enough to understand the miraculous birth of Isaac.

Illustration: "Big Sister Again", "Big Sister Finally"

Mocking = Same word used when Lot tells his son-in-laws that God is going to destroy the city Lot's son-in-laws think he's mocking/jesting about idea of destruction. Ridiculing the idea.

Galatians Paul likens this mocking by Ishmael as "Persecution"

Was This Much More Serious Than Some Sibling Mockery? Probably For 3 Reasons

- 1. Vs.10 Sarah's Reactions Is Very Stern & Deliberate
 - · Sarah seems to go into full "mamma-bear mode"
 - Her response is to get Ishmael and Hagar out of the house completely.
 - Maybe she considered Ishmael's actions to no longer be safe for Isaac?

2. Vs. 11-13 The Matter Distressed Abraham Greatly Because of His Son

- God appears to comfort Abraham by graciously reminding Him of the promise
- Isaac is the promised seed, but Ishmael will be great as well.

3. Paul's Use of This Event In Galatians Serves As A Rebuke to Judaisers Promoting Legalism

- Paul is reminding that adherence only to the Law leads to bondage
- But life in Christ leads to freedom
- Paul says that one son persecuted the other and was sent away accordingly because he was NOT the son in whom the promise or covenant lied.

Interesting Parallels Between Ishmael's Birth and Isaac's Birth

- Genesis 16 Hagar Despised Sarah When She Became Pregnant
- · Genesis 21 Ishmael Is Now Mocking Isaac
- · Genesis 16 Hagar Fled From Abraham & Sarah's House To Escape Sarah's Anger
- · Genesis 21 This Time Hagar Is Directed to Leave & Told to Get Out of Their House

God's Instruction to Abraham to Dismiss Ishmael May Have Been A Precursor

Vs. 12 "Do Not Be Distressed Because of the Lad For Through Isaac Your Descendants Shall Be Named"

- God will eventually call Abraham to the mountain with Isaac
- This is much harder when Ishmael is gone. There is no backup plan.
- · Ishmael's removal turns Isaac into a first fruit offering.
- "Whoever is found faithful with a little can be faithful with much"
- It was clearly very hard for Abraham to dismiss Ishmael

There Is Also Some Interesting Imagery With Ishmael Being Sent Off Into the Wilderness Leviticus 16:7-10, 20-22

- · Here we have two goats chosen by lot.
- · One is Dedicated to the Lord, and the Other Sent Off Into the Wilderness
 - Pilate presented Barabbas & Jesus before crowds (it was custom to free prisoner at Passover)
 - Barabbas is freed and sent out like the scape goat.
- · Jesus remained as an atonement for the sins of the world. Barrabbas was sent off.
- Here in this passage we have Isaac in whom the covenant is confirmed and perpetuated
- And we have Ishmael sent off into the wilderness

These Guys ARE NOT Atoning Sacrifices Like Jesus & the Goats

There IS NO Salvific Work on Behalf of Barabbas

There is Just An Interesting Imagery of the Vessels God Uses.

21:14-17 Abraham Sends Hagar & Ishmael Away

Vs. 16 Isn't it interesting that the unit of measurement used here is a bowshot

• Vs. 20 tells us Ishmael became an archer

God Is Faithful To Hagar in 4 Ways In This Mini Exile They Experience

- 1. God Heard Their Cries
 - Vs. 16 & 17 Reveal both Hagar and Ishmael crying out to the Lord in distress.
 - Vs. 17 "Do not fear for God has heard the voice of the lad where he is."
 - Gen.16:13-14 Maybe she learned to cry out to God from her last experience?
 - Maybe this is even why the angel asks what her crying is about?
 - Gen.16 also implies that she stopped at a well. She needs water again.

2. God Reiterates His Promise to Her Because of His Faithfulness to Abraham

- Vs. 18 "Arise, take your son by the hand because I am going to make a great nation of him."
- Hagar should have known from God's previous promises to her.
- God is gracious to remind us of His faithfulness
- Disciples should have known the prophecies of the Messiah too.

3. God Provided For Their Physical Needs

- Vs. 19. "Then God opened her eyes and she saw a well of water....."
- This may have been a supernatural oasis God formed?
- Or, this may have been God leading them to a well that they just had not seen.
- Have you ever been so focussed on your trouble that you didn't see the provision in front?

4. God Was With Ishmael, He Became An Archer, He Married, & He Became A Great Nation

• Vs. 20-21 "God was with the lad, and he grew, and he lived int he wilderness, and became an archer.....and his mother took a wife for him.

Summary:

We Have Previously Highlighted How Aspects of God's Covenant With Abraham Can Be Seen As Conditional & Unconditional

I Believe These Events Reveal The Unconditional Aspects of The Abrahamic Covenant

1. God Was Extremely Faithful and Gracious to Sarah Through Isaac

- Despite Abraham & Sarah taking matters into their own hands to create a son with Hagar, God was still faithful to give them the Son He Promised.
- God didn't disqualify them and void His original plan when Ishmael came along
- He blessed Abraham and Sarah and took away her disgrace and reproach

2. God Was Extremely Faithful and Gracious to Hagar Through Ishmael

- Despite the fact that he was not the promised seed, he was still Abraham's son and God honored that.
- God promised to make Abraham into a great nation. Even though Abraham misappropriated that promise, God still honored it to Ishmael.

Sarah & Hagar Were Blessed As A Result of God's Faithfulness & Covenant w/ Abraham

- People around us should be blessed by God's faithfulness to us through the New Covenant of Jesus
- He can be faithful to them too, but our blessings should overflow and impact those around us.

Our Sin Can Likewise Affect The People Around Us

- Discord between Ishmael & Isaac leads to discord between Sarah & Hagar which leads to discord between Abraham and Hagar, which leads to discord between Abraham and his son Ishmael, with leads to discord in the world today.
- The present discord in the middle east traces back to these brothers.
- This is all because Abraham and Sarah took matters into their own hands
- God promises to wash our sins as far as the East from the West, but sometimes we must still live with the worldly day to day consequences.

Ishmael Mocked The Promised Son Isaac- Sometimes Our Actions & Attitudes Mock Jesus

- We don't stand at the base of the cross and tell Jesus to come down if You're truly God
- But we mock the cross when we behave like its not enough for our situations.
- We mock the cross when we fail to stand for what is right and Biblical because we're afraid of the peer pressure or what others might think.
- Ishmael was probably a little scared, a little angry, a little confused, and most certainly a little jealous.
- His response was to act out and antagonize Isaac.
- Have your circumstances ever caused you to act-out with less than ideal faith in Jesus?
