Safely/humanely reduce the population of homeless, abandoned, lost cats & dogs and provide food assistance to community neighbors in need of supplemental support for themselves, their families and their indoor/outdoor pets.

Initiatives: Community outreach via educational flyers, canvassing neighborhoods, collaborating with community neighbors, charitable partners/organizations with same passion/goal to reach our neighborhood communities with food insecurities, Vets & Pets in need and when possible; pair a Pet with a Vet in a forever home:

No Veteran Left Behind - <https://veteranrescue.org/> is an organization dedicated to assist the men and women who served in the armed forces, and their families; to assure that they assimilate seamlessly back into civilian life and are aware of all of the services available to them.

Veterans Affairs - <https://www.va.gov/> is a Cabinet-level executive branch department of the federal government charged with providing life-long healthcare services to eligible military veterans at the 170 VA medical centers and outpatient clinics located throughout the country.

Trap-Neuter/Spay-Return/TNR program - <https://www.neighborhoodcats.org/how-to-tnr/getting-started/what-is-tnr> is a program developed to help neighborhood communities with over population on cats by spay/neuter, vaccinating. When necessary & authorized, the cats are administered life sustaining medications to safely returned them back to their neighborhood colon.

CATS

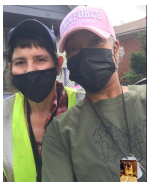
1. Significant reduction in cat population over time

 - a. Odor from spraying

 - c. Visibility from roaming
