


#### ANNUAL MEETING

#### Lake Report Spring 2024

The lake level has been unseasonably high due to the substantial amounts of rain in December and January. Through early March, we have not had to pump any replenishment water out of Lake Eldridge; this has saved us considerable expense to date. However, the long hot, dry summer is coming soon.

Please advise your lawn care people to avoid blowing grass and leaves into the lake or into the street (which ends up in the lake via the storm drains). Additionally, the tree trimming must be performed in a manner to eliminate limbs from falling and remaining in the lake.

It is the time of year that we start using our boats more on the lake. Please keep your speed and resulting wake to a minimum; particularly when the water levels are high. For those using boats after dark, make sure to use your functioning red and green bow lights and white stern lights for visibility. Also, stay more towards the center of the lake when cruising after dark for the privacy of the homeowners.

We are continuing to dye the lake for aesthetic purposes.

#### **Bulkhead**

Your association board has been engaged in finding solutions for protecting our neighborhood's single greatest physical asset, our lake. As you are aware our lake is owned by the association and it is all our responsibility as residents to look after our lake. It is therefore our responsibility to maintain the lake as a viable ecosystem which includes monitoring and minimizing the amount of silt and other organic debris entering the lake. Pumping water from Eldridge Lake and organic debris from trees, yards and our streets are the biggest contributors. Compromised or failing bulkheads are proven to allow erosion resulting in silt and other organic debris to enter into the lake as well. As a property owner we are all responsible to maintain our bulkheads, repair them as necessary and replace them from time to time. This can be a costly adventure but it is our responsibility and obligation as residents per the deed restrictions "It shall be the responsibility of each property owner to maintain his or her property at the water line and providing and maintaining in good condition a bulkhead of a type approved by the Architectural Control Committee so as to prevent erosion."

A guick inspection of a bulkhead and dock can indicate erosion of a compromised bulkhead. If the bulkhead is leaning toward the lake it is no longer strong enough to hold back the soil behind it. If the yard is lower behind the bulkhead, there is slumping of soil behind the bulkhead or even separation of soil from the bulkhead these are good indications the bulkhead is no longer doing its job. Additionally if vegetation is growing through the bulkhead this could be a strong indication the bulkhead is compromised. Trees and other vegetation planted too close to or against the bulkhead will eventually cause damage and compromise the bulkhead. If your bulkhead has round posts (water side of the bulkhead) then your bulkhead has been there for quite some time. This does not necessarily mean the bulkhead should be replaced if it is still doing its job preventing erosion but keep in mind it, like all bulkheads, it will require eventual replacing. Also please be mindful of your dock as they do not last forever either. A dock was actually found floating in the lake not long ago, three Board Members volunteered to remove this from the lake. We are still not sure as to which house this dock came from.

A casual inspection of bulkheads and docks takes place from time to time. If a bulkhead exhibits any of the above conditions a letter will be sent to the owner reminding them of the necessity to maintain and replace our bulkheads as required. If you need to repair or replace your bulkhead, please be reminded to submit the necessary application to the Management Company/Architectural Control Committee and hire a qualified contractor to do the work. Simply building something to mask the problem is not a solution.
