Lake Report Summer 2024

The most noticeable issue with our lake this year is that the water level has maintained itself at a relatively high, acceptable, level due to rainwater. We have not had to pump any replenishment water into the lake so far this year which saves us large amounts of money. Some of you may notice some boat activity up by the dam soon. We are conducting a localized sediment analysis in this area (pump discharge) to assess the difference over the past 3 years as a result of pumping water in from Lake Eldridge. We know that the incoming water is high in sediment content, and we are trying to assess the long-term effects because of this activity. We will continue to dye the lake as needed to appear more aesthetically pleasing.

Unlike during Harvey, our dam worked as intended during Beryl. Lake Eldrige never rose up to the top of our dam and our water continued to flow outward back into Lake Eldridge throughout the entire storm period. This prevented us from receiving excess quantities of sediment laden water and trash fish during the flooding. We are running additional testing following all the yard and street runoff, but it would be advisable to avoid swimming in the lake for a few weeks until the chemistry is balanced again.

4th of July Boat Parade

Our annual boat parade is always a beautiful sight, and this year was no different, with so many participating in boats and waving on from the shoreline. It was wonderful to see everyone's patriotism with unique decorations, making it a truly memorable event for our community. Congratulations to our décor winners—the judge's favorite boat... first place went to the Fergusons of Santa Maria. The second most favorite was the Vonderhaars of Savoy. Congratulations and thank you to all who participated!

From the Deed Restrictions Committee

Ah summer in VE, boating, fishing, enjoying the evening breezes on your patio and dock (OK, not so much the mosquitoes). If you are like most of us you enjoy the outdoors and the country like vibe of VE. There were actually a couple of lightning bugs in our backyard the other evening but sadly that has become much less frequent than it used to be. Lights interfere with this country like vibe and those of us enjoying the outdoors of evenings. the night sky and stars. Today's light technology and some of the LED lights now available can be extremely bright. Therefore please be mindful of your neighbors and please be reminded that our restrictions require outdoor lights on the sides and backs of our homes to be shrouded and downcast so as not to broadcast into adjacent properties nor across the water. This applies not only to the lights attached to our homes but also lights on or near the water such as our docks. Lights on our docks and patios may look nice but they also broadcast across the water into our neighbors' yards and homes. Lighting on our docks is discouraged but allowed as long as it does not broadcast and is not of all night duration. Lighting on the bulkheads is discouraged (except as temporary holiday decoration) as it reflects off the water and therefore broadcasts across the water. All exterior lighting must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee.

Thanks for considering your neighbors and have a great summer.


