We will be offering over 50 varieties of shrubs and trees in 2026! Many of these products are grown from rooted cuttings at our State of WI Nursery Grower and Dealer Licensed & Inspected location in Sheboygan Falls, Wisconsin. Our goal is to provide high quality nursery shrubs and trees at reasonable prices.

A few notes for 2026:

1. 2025 overall nursery survival rate was 99.62%, so 38 out of 10,000 died. This was very good results and all pots are watered by computer control with chemical injection systems to maintain pH and nutrient levels.
2. We are 'by appointment' for 2026, but plan for a more permanent store front in the future.
3. Overall pricing for 2026 will be lower than 2025 as we have better long term pricing on our raw materials. Sheboygan County sales tax is already included in pricing to keep things simple

We are a small, family owned nursery growing around 10,000 items along the Sheboygan River. Our family began the nursery after years of planting thousands of our own trees. Mandi performs marketing and sales, Keith takes care of operations, Lincoln (9) maintains the mix pit and Camille (7) tags and labels trees. We're dedicated to growing healthy, quality trees and shrubs at a reasonable cost.

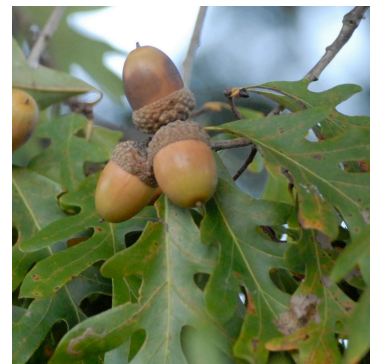

### Riverside Nursery - Planting and Pruning

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### Planting Instructions:

Your potted trees come in a potting mix that is a mix of chip/peat moss/organic matter. Keep as much of this mix with the tree as possible when planting. pH of the pot is typically 6.0 to 6.5, right where maximum nutrient uptake takes place.

Start by digging a hole that is at least the depth of the pot and 2 times the width. Deeper and wider is always better, but we break up and repot everything on 18-24 month intervals; so they should not be root bound like box store factory produced trees. It is not surprising to see many of the pots fall apart nicely when removing the tree.

For trees with large tap roots, ensure this tap root is running as straight down as possible while spreading secondary and tertiary roots to the sides. Pack the hole tightly and chip the top (not necessary, just for looks). Nothing is more important than getting this tap root down straight.

Fertilizer the first year is not required as all pots have a 6 month timed release applied in April. Light fertilizer such as Milorganite is fine and will not hurt. Things like 10-10-10 should not be used in the first season.

Water trees occasionally ensuring the ground is always at least damp, but never underwater. Your ground type will make a big difference here. Sand you want to water daily, pure clay can be as little as weekly.

### Pruning Instructions:

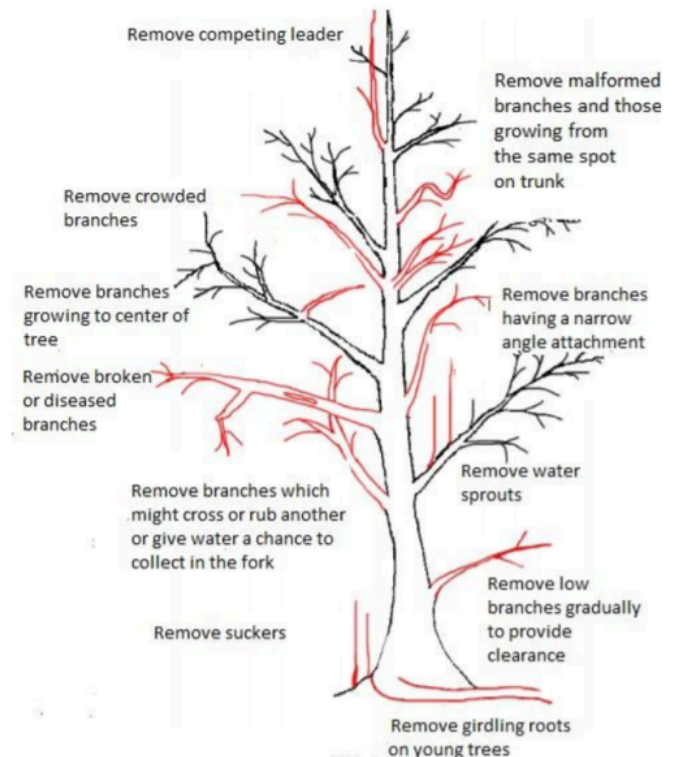
Pruning in the first growing season after planting is stressful on the greenery and should be avoided, but can be performed during cooler months before summer heat.

Many deciduous trees should be limited when they are allowed to split the leader. We typically keep a single leader until 8' or 10' depending on variety. Conifers should always be limited to a single leader as long as possible.

Pruning any branches coming 'down' off a side branch is also recommended.

Many varieties are considered 'self-pruning' once they get larger, so these steps are only required when they are at an intermediate age.

Check your variety with a reputable source for pruning timing based on zone 5, such as University of Wisconsin or University of Minnesota who have many resources on your specific variety of greenery.
