We have one single objective: Impact. Sustainable Impact.







A KEY FOCUS FROM 2022 HAS BEEN OUR PARTNERSHIP with NELSON MANDELA CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL. We work closely with them on long-term workshops and interventions for chronically ill patients, and their families. Our current project is located in the Dialysis Unit. Our first intervention was an art-photography collaboration (See later) in 2022

- The **VOKO DIGITAL SUPERHEROE** project provides chronically ill children and families with an opportunity to express themselves visually, orally, digitally and physically.
- The outputs form part of regular social media and PR campaigns on organ donation and kidney awareness
- Children are in dialysis 2 to 3 days per week for 4 hours. Some travel from Limpopo every day = 12 hours
- The project is run by our founder, Kathryn Berman, and Boinahano (Bilal) Phofoli who visit twice weekly
- Our interventions have brought joy and healing
- Funded for by National Arts Council Presidential Employment Stimulus Package initially, ongoing CSI funding is sought through private donors.






NOX'S MATRIC DANCE

ECD NETWORK ALEX TOWNSHIP

A collective of 10 ECD centres based in Alexandra Township, the Alexandra ECD Network brings successful ECD founder-owners together to share procurement, skills transfer and build a consolidated business model

Collectively and separately, the ECDs look after 300+ children 3 - 7 years, and approximately 35 educators in facilities across Alex - large and small, well- and under-resourced.

They frequently stage fundraising and educational events - from young chef competitions to vintage fashion shows. The culmination of each year is a graduation and Christmas party.

Hours are 6h00 to 18h00 daily weekdays
Needs range from food, toys, stationery through to building, infrastructure and interior needs - from toilets and water tanks to mattresses and flooring.

PHRONESIS STUDENTS DEVELOPMENT TRUST

PHRONESIS was founded in Kya Sands Informal Settlement. by Tsitsi Sekgobela, founder and executive director.

- Phronesis has evolved from a weekly feeding scheme into a creche, ECD Centre and Foundation Phase school - to Grade 4 - with expansion to Grade 7 by 2023
- 140 children are professionally schooled and fed twice daily, five days per week.
- All learners are provided with uniforms, schools, bags and educated by thirteen teachers - none of whom, unfortunately, have formal pedagogic training.
- The new school - for which we created these charming murals - has 8 class rooms housing the creche, ECD and Grades 1-4 learners.
- All learning materials are provided in accordance with the curriculum and
- Boinahano Phafol worked full-time as art and computer teacher.
- With 5 donated laptops, a new computer centre was established in October 2021, where Boinahano has established a computer academy.
- Additional facilities include a catering kitchen., administration block, vege-garden, recreational lawn, swop shop, and ablution facilities - all built over the past six years by the founder leveraging the assistance of her husband, a construction entrepreneur.
- We continue to support both the ECD centre and have adopted a family of 3 learners with one cerebral palsied child as scholarship beneficiaries.

ECD TO HIGH SCHOOL VICTORIA YARDS: TIMBUKTU IN THE VALLEY

Established in 2018 by visiting German journalist, Victoria Schneider, Timbuktu in the Valley spontaneously met the needs of the youth of the Bez Valley neighbourhood who are largely children of immigrants and refugees.

- Currently they serve 98 young people daily in during- and after-school activities, from 9h00 to 17h00
- Activities range from schooling to cultural activities with oversight from 6 mentors
- There are currently 30 non-school attendees day-long, 18 under-fives and 20 afternoon kids



VICTORIA YARDS: SAFESTUDY

Established during the lockdown of 2020, teaching the youth of BezValley on the sidewalks in the food lines, the project graduated to Saturday mornings and 240 youth engaged in activities as diverse as study, physical, artistic and recreational skills - from hip hop to magic. And now daily hosting. - with Vuyo Ndlalela (Lassie)

- Prior to lock-down, Positive Vibrations enjoyed extensive support from corporates - for both performance bookings and CSI outreach.

RUDO INSTITUTE DAV EYTON

- While I4G was not directly involved, Kathy served as a mentor on a British Council acceleration programme which introduced her to Sarah Madingwana and Kwandile Sikhosana - now a director of I4G.
- Rudo developed from a library service offered throughout Daveyton into an innovation hub.
- Established in the garage of Sarah's family home, in Daveyton, Rudo Institute primarily provides career focused services and training for High School learners and employment seekers
- Training includes computer literacy and work-readiness
- Rudo Institute also acts as an innovation hub.
- Rudo Institute and founders have been recipients of several awards and accolades over the years.
