We are a small farm outside of Augusta GA, in Appling, raising Holland lops. Our rabbits are held and socialized daily. Please contact us directly for individual pricing and view our Facebook page for updates. We have a variety of colors in our herd: harlequin, magpie, tort, otter, black, lilac and blue. We have VM in our lines and several blue-eyed beauties.

We will begin posting pictures within the first few days of a new litter. At three (3) weeks, we will post sex and color of each new baby. Deposits will be accepted on a first-come-first-serve basis at this time. We accept Venmo, Paypal (friends and family only) and Zelle. Please communicate early on if you are interested in a baby that is posted. Rabbits are \$65-\$90 (pricing dependent on color, quality and pedigree). The deposit will be \$30-\$45 (½ of total cost).

Final payment is due <u>on or before</u> the pick up date. Final payment can be made through the above methods OR cash. **No checks**. Prices are non-negotiable/**Deposits are non-refundable**.

If the rabbit becomes ill under my care, the buyer will have the option to pick another rabbit (if available), wait for the next litter (and have first pick) or receive a full refund.

We will give the buyer a day and time for pickup (in the Augusta/Appling/Thomson GA area). Sellers are willing to drive up to a 60 mile radius if their schedule permits. If you fail to pick up your rabbit as scheduled, you will forfeit your payment. Please ask for the pickup schedule before making a deposit. If you would like to work with a transport company, you are responsible for making all arrangements and the same radius applies and is dependent on our schedule.

Please bring a carrier to transport your rabbit.

We do not knowingly sell any sick rabbits. Our rabbits will be healthy to the best of our knowledge when they leave our farm. We are not responsible for the health of the rabbit after it leaves. We are not responsible for any vet costs after the animal transfers ownership.

Information about Rabbit Ownership!

<u>Litter box training</u> is possible and should happen as soon as you bring the rabbit home. Please reduce the rabbits space - leaving <u>just enough</u> room to lay down/eat and drink and get into the litter box. Pick up stray pellets as often as you can and place them inside the litter box. Clean up accidents as soon as you can. It is helpful if your hay feeder is positioned over/in the litter box while training. Don't change the litter box too frequently, especially while you are litter box training. When you do change the box, leave a few pellets for scent. This training (usually) takes approximately 7-10 days. Gradually allow more space for your rabbit to see how they do and adjust accordingly. Don't allow your training rabbit to hop around unsupervised.

We will supply a small bag of pellets to assist with the food transition (if you have a different brand of pellets). Please follow the transition instructions!

To transition from one type/brand of pellets to another:

Days 1 & 2 - 75% old food/25% new food

Days 3 & 4 - 50/50

Days 5 & 6- 25% old food/75% new food

By day 7 - 100% new food (If you have any old food left, mix in a little every day until it is gone.)

How much will your new bunny eat a day?

- Hay Offer the bunny fresh hay daily (typically a hay pile the size of your bunny)(which will equate to about 2 pounds of hay per month)
- Pellets as much as they want until about 3-4 months old; after that, about ½ cup a day
- NO fresh veggies/fruit until after 3 months of age search which veggies/fruits a rabbit can and cannot have!

Supplies that we use at the farm are posted on this website.

The key to a good pet - LOTS of attention and love! While we have socialized all of our bunnies, we cannot guarantee that they will have a perfect temperament. They each have their own personalities.
