

JAN REE SWIMMING POOL RULES

Please take a minute and review the safety guidelines we have for the pool. Please also go over them with your families. Safety is always our #1 concern!

- No one may swim alone. This is a state law.
- Everyone must shower before entering the pool. This is a state law.
- Everyone must sign in and out with Lifeguard. This includes guests. This is a state law.
- No smoking allowed ANYWHERE on Jan Ree Pool's property & please respect our neighbors.
- No alcohol or other intoxicants may be brought on the pool premises.
- No food or drinks are allowed on the pool deck.
- Music must be played at a low, comfortable level, respecting all our members & neighbors.
- No running, pushing, wrestling, ball playing, or undue disturbances in or around the pool area.
- Admission will be denied to anyone with open sores, colds, coughs, inflamed eyes, infections or bandages.
- No abusive or foul language is permitted.
- Only one person at a time may use the diving board.
- No hanging or sitting on the deep water line is allowed.
- The water safety line must be in place unless lap swimming is taking place. This is a state law.
- Members may bring their own chairs, chaises and umbrellas.
- All persons using the club grounds shall do so in a quiet respectful manner.
- Small children (3 and under) must be in a swim diaper.
- When hosting a pool party, member must be present until all party guests exit the property.
- If members bring guests to the pool, the member must be present while guest is on the property.

Here are the child/teen swimming guidelines-

Age 9 and under must be supervised by someone 14 or older.

Age 10-13 must take and pass a swim test if they want to be left unsupervised at the pool. The test will be to swim 2 lengths of the pool and tread water for 1 minute.

Age 14+ can supervise.

If there are any incidents of children/teens who are breaking rules and being disrespectful without an adult at the pool, they will be warned and possibly lose their privileges to be at the pool without an adult. It will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
