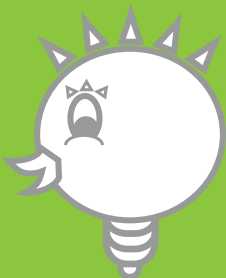

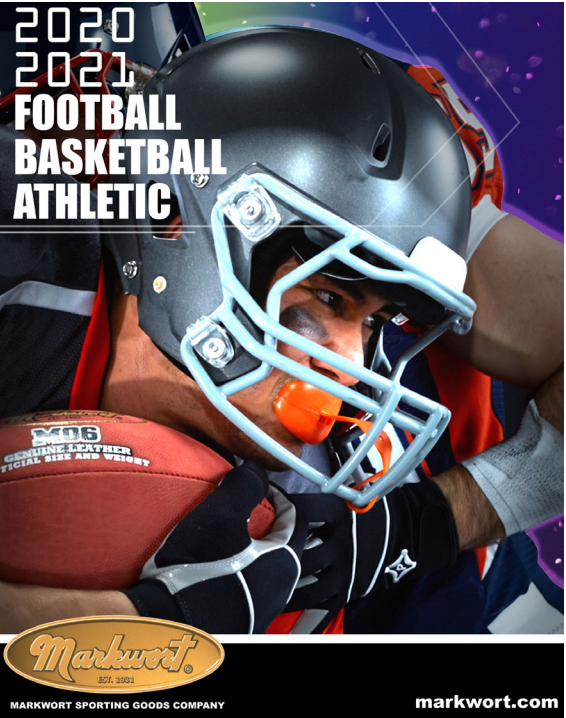
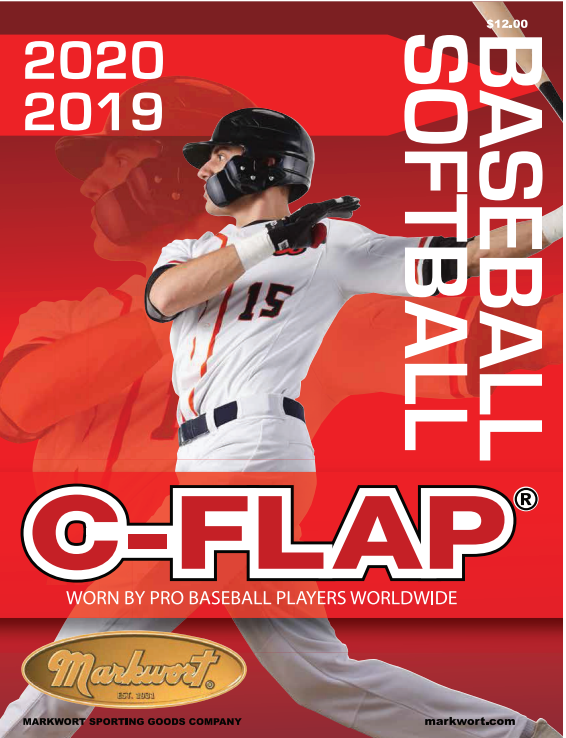

WHO DEVELOPED THE C-FLAP? BELOW IS AN INTERVIEW THAT FIRST APPEARED IN JUNIOR BASEBALL MAGAZINE TALKING TO THE FOUNDER OF C-FLAP, DR. ROBERT CROW.

Junior Baseball: Although many of our readers may have seen the protective flap used before, can you describe the basic design and benefit for the user?

Dr. Robert Crow: C-Flap is a facemask made of Lexan (a strong polycarbonate) with a foam pad attached to the inner surface and is color matched to the baseball helmet. It attaches to the ear flap on the side of the player's helmet facing the pitcher and extends over the cheek and jaw.

JB: What was your original inspiration for developing the C-Flap?

RC: I am a Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeon and served as one of the team physicians for the Atlanta Braves for twenty-six years. During this time I treated a number of players with facial injuries. Following reconstruction it was my hope to have a device that would give some protection to the injured area when the player returned to the game. Full facemasks were available but players found that they interfered with their ability to see a pitched ball and also covered their mouths. Because of these concerns I developed C-Flap. This guard is a unilateral guard which extended from the ear flap on the side of the batter's helmet facing the pitcher. It was made so that it did not interfere with vision or cover the mouth.

JB: How was the C-Flap initially received by the baseball community when it was first developed?

RC: Prototypes were initially designed and presented to many professional players for their comments and suggestions. Acceptance was initially slow but once a few players tried the guard and became comfortable with it, they began to use it. When youth players and coaches, as well as parents, saw it, it was they too began to use it. Today it is employed by multiple youth and minor league teams as well as by more and more professionals.

JB: As the modern sports world has become more educated about head injuries (i.e. concussions), have you seen an increase in the willingness and utilization of the C-Flap by players?

RC: C-Flap was developed in the 80's and has been available for use for more than 30 years. Other safety equipment has been available to protect against severe injuries that have become more prevalent. In my opinion, the game of baseball has not changed in concept but players are being trained and conditioned better.

JB: Early in the 2017 MLB season, Milwaukee Brewers outfielder Khris Bryant, who was wearing the C-Flap at the time, was struck in the face by a fastball while batting. He later told reporters that the protective gear "saved my life" and urged his professional peers to give the C-Flap design a chance. Do you think scary moments such as this one will drive more big league players (and subsequently youth players) to try C-Flap out?

RC: More players (both youth and professional) are beginning to use C-Flap because they have seen it in use and found it does not interfere with their ability to see a pitched ball or cover their mouths. It is lightweight, and it appears as an extension of the helmet rather than an attachment. Continued use by both youth and professional players will hopefully encourage others to incorporate it and in turn reduce the number of facial injuries.

HOW OLD ARE YOUR BATTING HELMETS?

We at MARKWORT® SPORTING GOODS need your help to find out how old your team's batting helmets are and also how old your catcher's helmets are. Provide us with this information and receive a FREE C-FLAP.

Please detail when you last purchased your helmets, the helmet brand, model number and if you can see inside when your helmets where made please provide that information too.

When do you plan to purchase new helmets? Does the team have more than one helmet per player? Extra backup helmets and if so how many? Does the team get everyone on the team a new helmet at the same time or do they just buy say 6 or so new helmets every time they buy new helmets and rotate them in? What happens to the old helmets?

For your information most helmet makers only SEI Certify that their helmets meet the NOCSAE Standard for 1 year or 2 years from date of purchase. There should be a sticker in each helmet (or molded under the bill of the batting helmet) stating 1-year or 2-years. (Hockey style catcher's helmets might have the sticker or raised molded lettering on the back of the helmet). Some makers also date certification is only valid for 3 years from date of manufacture whichever comes first so if you buy a helmet that is certified for 2-years from date of purchase but it was manufactured 2 years ago then you only get 1-year of use while the helmet is still certified.

Markwort Sporting Goods Company believes all of this is unnecessarily confusing and the result today is that we estimate only about 20% of all batting helmets in this country are currently still SEI certified and only about 10% of the catcher's helmets. Which means 80% of all batter's are playing in a helmet that is no longer SEI certified and 90% of catcher's are playing in a helmet that is not SEI certified. This also means that when the umpire asks the coach if all of his team's equipment is legal and currently SEI Certified to the NOCSAE standards many coaches are going to be between a rock and a hard place to correctly answer. We have some ideas to solve this problem but need this data to help make our points. We also welcome your ideas to this.
