I. On occasion, God drops directly into the lives of men and women to forward His plan

II. But for the most part, our days seem to be made up of mostly random events

*Your faith is not designed to move God. A Christian's faith is faith which moves us to trust God when He does not seem to be moving.

III. Faith responds to the seemingly random events of life and trusts that they are part of the perfect plan of God.

In Him we were also **chosen**, having been **predestined** according to the plan of Him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of His will, in order that we, who were the first to put our hope in Christ, might be for the praise of His glory. Ephesians 1:11-12

*You were created for a purpose. Often you find it. Sometimes you miss part of it. Occasionally you find it immediately. Sometimes we find it eventually. At Christmas, we are reminded of how life is not nearly as random as it seems as God often uses situations and circumstances to dismantle what we thought would be for what He desires.

There is a story taking place. A divine story.

And God invites us to participate in His story.

"I am the Lord's servant. May it be to me as you have said."
