


Introducing our New Commissioners

We also received over 1,400 free FEMA shelf stable meals this spring to give to those most in need. For up to date info on help from CCDAS, visit: chesco.org/aging.




On the Lighter Side...

Free Resources





BANANA BREAD


Make for your family or to share with someone on your Meals on Wheels route (just check first for allergies or if diabetic).

INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 4 bananas
- 1-1/2 cups flour
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp vanilla

Heat oven to 350.

Beat together first 3 ingredients. Add bananas and beat again. Then add dry ingredients and vanilla. (Optional: add 1/2 cup chocolate chips.) Grease and flour a loaf pan. Bake for 55-60 minutes. Makes 1 loaf. Enjoy!
