Mary Anne Keen has been a volunteer with Meals on Wheels for 43 years. She runs our East Coventry/Vincent Chapter which means she schedules and trains volunteers, interviews new clients, and coordinates with the food provider for that area.

I was born in 1928, the first of five children. By December, 1935, there were four of us plus our parents. The depression kept us moving around. I went to five different elementary schools. Parents of depression children carried the burden of it on their shoulders. But I didn't mind at all. No one had any more than we did. We were living in PA when Pearl Harbor hit, so we stayed here. I met my husband, Len, when he came home from the war. We were married for 72 years.

Len worked for Bell of PA. The telephone has changed as much as anything in my lifetime. A friend of mine said, "We didn't have a phone but our grandmother did, and she only lived a mile down the road, so when we needed a phone, we just walked to her house." Today the phone plays movies, does our banking, shows us how to do things, and answers most everything we ask. Besides all of that, you can still talk on it!

I have been a Girl Scout leader, a den mother, president of the PTA, a Sunday school teacher, and a poll worker. I have driven


# Tribute to a Special Lady, Gloria Buckwalter

Happy 97th Gloria!



# PROTECT YOURSELF FROM FRAUD

Anyone can be scammed – it does not matter how intelligent you are. Scammers can manipulate caller ID to say they are the IRS, your bank, or even the police. They use information they have already gathered about you to instill fear and make you more likely to comply. There are red flags though. You need to be on alert for them.

The most common scam is the IRS scam in which you are told you owe taxes and immediate payment is needed. Red Flag: The IRS does **NOT** make

unsolicited calls to citizens. Another common scam is the sweepstakes scam, in which you are sent a fake check and asked to deposit it, only to have it rejected later while the thieves now have your account information. Red Flag: If it's too good to be true, it's probably not.

Another common scam is the grandparent scam, in which you receive a call from the police informing you that your grandchild is in trouble and needs your financial help. Most scams share a common requirement that you act immediately. Don't!

You need to know for sure who you are dealing with. If the caller says they are your bank, <u>say you'll call them back</u>. Then look up the bank's number and call them yourself. Do the same with a call from the police. If it's your credit card company, call the number on the back of your card.

And remember, never give out your full Social Security Number, Medicare Number, credit card or bank account number, or any other personal information over the phone unless <u>you</u> initiated the call. If you are not sure who you are talking to, say you will call them back.

#### **EVER WONDER WHERE YOUR DONATIONS GO?**

When you donate to Meals on Wheels of Chester County (MOWCC), your money purchases the hot, nutritious meals that are delivered to homebound residents of Chester County, PA.

MOWCC purchases meals from 13 different food providers in the county. Each food provider charges a different price ranging from \$3.40 to \$6.00 a day per person. Last year, the client contributions we received only paid for 45% of the cost of meals. That is why donations from the community are so important!

During COVID-19, people are struggling even more to pay bills. Many seniors have to choose between paying rent, getting much needed medicine or buying food. If you can help, please donate to MOWCC. You can even write on your check specifically where you want your donation to go (i.e. "Coatesville Chapter" or "where most needed").

Most clients get 22 meals a month or about 260 meals a year. Our typical client is elderly, lives alone, struggles financially and often has limited help from family or friends. So, if you donate \$1,000, you have paid for an entire year for one of these vulnerable clients. Or...

\$100 could buy hot lunches for someone for a month!


\$25 would cover meals for one week.

### For Volunteers....

Your safety is very important to us. We cancel meal delivery if roads are dangerous due to snow or ice. We have always followed school closings due to the weather. However, with COVID-19, it is hard to know if schools are open or virtual. So, this year we will depend on you, the volunteer, to contact our main office if you think it is unsafe to drive. Please try to decide as early as possible so we can alert our clients and cancel meals with the food provider in your area.





Also, if you are delivering but there is a client whose driveway is not passable because of snow or ice (or the sidewalk is snowy or icy), please skip that home, and give the meal to someone else. Always call the main office if you are unable to deliver to someone's home. We do not want you to risk falling or getting your car stuck in the snow.

Emergency meals are available for anyone who does not have food on hand for those days when we have to cancel delivery. If you know of a client whose "cupboard" is bare and could really use some emergency meals, please email us at: meals@mowcc.org.

# For Clients who receive meals...



If you look out your window and there is substantial snow or ice, you can assume there will be no meal delivery that day. All of our drivers are volunteers using their own cars and cannot be expected to bring your meal if the roads are not safe. If you feel your driveway or door is blocked due to snow or ice, please call the main office so we can warn the drivers.

Try to always have some emergency food available in case the weather is bad and Meals on Wheels cannot deliver to you. If you are unable to obtain emergency food, call our office and we will bring you some meals and/or snacks that you can keep on hand.

The Chester County Food Bank (which provides meals for Downingtown, Glen Springs and Uwchlan Whitelands Chapters) will be closed December 24 and not reopen until Monday January 4th.

Clients living in Downingtown, Exton, Frazer and Chester Springs will receive a box of 5 frozen meals on 12/22. There will be no hot meal delivery from December 24th—January 4th for people living in those areas.
