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Partner Spotlight On ...

Carey Snow, Director of Culinary Operations Chester County Food Bank

Carey moved to Pennsylvania from Massachusetts at the urging of her twin sister in August of 2020 in the midst of the pandemic. Feeling isolated and adrift, she was looking for a fresh start. Carey's culinary journey started at the Pine Street Inn, the largest shel-

ter for the unhoused in New England. She walked in the door in 2012 as a cook, and walked out the door in 2020 as Executive Sous Chef. While at Pine Street, she served 2900 meals a day at 29 different city sites, while managing the production side of its job training program. When she landed here in Pennsylvania, the Chester County Food Bank (CCFB) was a perfect fit. CCFB provides more than 50 meals daily for our Glen Springs, Downing-town and Uwchlan chapters.

On a typical day, Carey can be found nurturing the CCFB's workforce development program. She heads up their job training program, whose annual goal it is to graduate nearly 30 fully-trained individuals with culinary aspirations, and launch them into the workplace.

"1 really enjoy this job, Carey shared. "The people here are inspiring and mission driven. Everyday is something different. I might be doing inventory, packing meals, giving tours, working with students or whatever. The mission is to *get the food out*. And getting the food out is what we at CCFB do so well."

Carey is most proud of the CCFB's initiative to provide underserved children with lunch throughout the summer months when schools are closed. She worked diligently with agencies servicing families to collaborate on a kid-friendly menu. The first year of the program they served 12,000 lunches and are currently up to 20,000 meals each summer from June to August.

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

1. *William Henry Harrison.* Harrison loved nature so much, it's quite possible it contributed to his taste for squirrel, which was a common protein at the time.

2. *Abraham Lincoln*. Lincoln cited gingerbread cookies among one of his closely held favorites, but he was also very fond of bacon.

3. George W. Bush. Former White House Chef Cristeta Comerford told reporters after the president left office that Bush loved what staff called "homemade 'cheeseburger pizzas' because every ingredient of a cheeseburger is on top of a margherita pizza."

4. Zachary Taylor. Taylor's taste for Southern and Creole food led him to calas, which are similar to the treats consisting of fried dough covered in powdered sugar now known as beignets.

5. *Theodore Roosevelt.* According to Henrietta Nesbitt, Roosevelt's White House housekeeper, FDR loved grilled cheese sandwiches in addition to other classic American foods, including scrambled eggs, fish chowder, hot dogs, and fruitcake.
