The mission of the Chester County Department of Aging (CCDAS) is to provide home and community-based protection, advocacy, information and assistance to people aged 60 and over.

This agency is available to support your goal of living independently, leading an active life with dignity and respect and be free from abuse or neglect. Here's what to expect when you call CCDAS or when they contact you:

A Specialist will ask about your needs and concerns. They offer referrals and suggestions on numerous support resources in our community including housing, financial assistance, transportation, counseling, meal programs, nursing facilities, visiting doctors and more. You decide if any of these services are right for you.

Talking with CCDAS or scheduling a visit is completely voluntary but we encourage you to allow a CCDAS representative to visit your home. It is **only** meant to help our homebound seniors. Call **610-344-6350** or visit. **www.chesco.org/aging.**

PA Grants Funds to Improve Senior Centers



The Pennsylvania Department of Aging announced a \$3 million investment in 436 Senior Community Centers (SCCs) across the Commonwealth to help ensure older adults are supported in familiar, local places with services to stay healthy and connected to their communities.

These grants help SCCs fund larger-scale projects such as updating and modernizing facilities, providing new health and entertainment programs, upgrading technology, and enhancing nutrition services. The Phoenixville Senior Center

is among those awarded a grant for improvements and enhancements. Among the other grantees are the Kennett Area, West Chester and Oxford Senior Centers and Brandywine Valley Active Aging's Coatesville and Downingtown campuses.

2025 Strawberry Festival—June 6 & 7

The Strawberry Festival is returning in 2025 and has been reimagined and relocated to the heart of Downtown Coatesville.

The Rotary Club of Coatesville, in partnership with Coatesville 2nd Century Alliance, is bringing this family-friendly tradition back in an exciting new format while continuing its mission to benefit the greater Coatesville community.



The Strawberry Festival will take place on Main Street between 1st and 3rd Avenues, celebrating the kick-off to strawberry season. The event is free to attend and features pay-as-you-go activities. Opening night is Friday, June 6, from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m., and continues into Saturday, June 7, from noon to 9 p.m.



Festival-goers can expect a mix of nostalgic favorites and new attractions, including games, amusement rides, live entertainment, a strawberry drop zone, and plenty of delicious strawberry shortcakes. Coatesville 2nd Century Alliance will also feature vendors, crafts, and a diverse selection of food throughout the downtown area.

"Bringing the Strawberry Festival back is an exciting opportunity to revive a beloved tradition that has been a cornerstone of our community's summer celebrations for decades," said **Greg Krajewski**, President of the Rotary Club of Coatesville. "The Rotary Club of Coatesville, which helped start the festival years ago, was eager to see it continue in a fresh and meaningful way. Through collaboration with Coatesville 2nd Century Alliance, known for launching First Fridays in Downtown Coatesville, and the City of Coatesville, we saw a perfect opportunity to reimagine the festival and bring new energy to this cherished event."


