Executive Director Julie Gaudan and Christine McManus, Program Coordinator of Phoenixville Senior Center (PSC).

As we continue our series on the Chester County Senior Centers, this month we focus on the Phoenixville Senior Center (PSC) and the Executive Director, Julie Gaudan.

PSC is located in downtown Phoenixville (153 Church St.). The center offers a wide range of activities and serves a culturally diverse group of people beyond the local community including Spring City and Montgomery County residents. Although COVID limits some of the in-person classes and the opportunity to go in for lunch, PSC has provided over 120,000 meals since COVID began. They hope to fully open in January 2022.

PHOENIXVILLE SENIOR CENTER (PSC)

Currently, the drive through is open on Fridays, 10:00-11:00, to pick up frozen meals, bagged breakfasts, a 5-pound bag of produce, bread, milk, and eggs. **PLEASE CALL FIRST** to reserve what you need (610-935-1515). There are also a few small groups meeting at the facility such as exercise classes and mahjong.

PSC offers information and assistance for Apprise Counseling, tax preparation, rent rebates, SNAP program, Senior Food box program, Farmers Market Food Voucher program, and more. During COVID, you can call Cari at 610-935-1515 extension 24 for help with complicated Medicare Insurance Programs, Apprise or make an appointment for tax help in the coming year. Cari can also help you apply for SNAP, Senior Food Boxes, Rent Rebates, Food Vouchers and other government programs for seniors.

The center will be providing booster shots for those seniors who received Pfizer shots at least 6 months ago. Call the center to schedule your Pfizer booster.

Out of an abundance of caution PSC did not host indoor activities this fall because the Chester County positivity rate exceeded 5%. The PA Acting Health Secretary announced that 97% of COVID related deaths, 95% of hospitalizations and 94% of reported cases are in UNVACCINATED or NOT FULLY VACCINATED people.

You need to limit activities to essential trips, avoid crowds and wear a mask. Masks help prevent the development of variants.

PSC has been in the historic Sacred Heart Social Center since 1988. They have replaced windows and done a lot of restoration which offers an excellent space for activities.

There is still much more to do. The HVAC system needs replacing and there are plans to alter some areas for a private counseling area and other programs. The center's greatest need at the moment is financial. You can help improve this awesome facility by donating to the PSC. 
