After 40+ years of dedication to Meals on Wheels of Chester County, Mary Ann and Art Knechtel (pictured above) decided it was time to hang up their coolers and pass the baton.

During their tenure, they've served hundreds of Kennett Square residents. The Knectels were kind enough to sit down to lunch with us recently to reflect on their four decades of service to our senior neighbors.

Mary Ann, 86, and Art, 87, made their first delivery in the Kennett Square Chapter in 1984. Kendal in Longwood has always been the meal provider for Kennett Square. The Knechtels told us they often need to deliver meals directly to a client's dining room, unwrap the meal, retrieve napkins and cutlery, open beverages, cut food, and even dispense medicine. Mary Ann and Art learned early on that it's more than just a meal delivery. Even more important is the care and warmth volunteers show our homebound neighbors.

Vaccine Update



CDC recommends RSV vaccines for all adults ages 75 years and older, and for adults ages 60-74 years who are at increased risk of severe RSV.

CDC recommends an RSV vaccine if you are ages 60-74 and:

- Have chronic heart or lung disease
- •Have a weakened immune system
- Have certain other medical conditions. including severe obesity and severe diabetes
- •Live in a nursing home or other long-term care facility

Interesting," the newsman thought ... He then asked her if she wouldn't mind telling him a little about her first three husbands and what they did for a living.



Originally from the mid-west, Illinois and Michigan, respectively, Mary Ann and Art met while living in the same apartment building in San Francisco where they moved for work. Art was a chemical engineer and Mary Ann a flight attendant. After marrying in 1964 and moving to Delaware for Art's job with chemical giant Hercules, Mary Ann was first to deliver for Meals on Wheels with a girlfriend. Since retiring, Art has joined his wife on her route. They switch off which person is driving and which person is delivering. They've experienced so much while volunteering, from goats escorting them inside a client's home for delivery, having to make emergency calls for injured neighbors, to having to decline opening beers for waiting clients. Sometimes they make connections with clients through church affiliations and hobbies, like classic cars.

Mary Ann and Art will continue to fill their days with service, with a little more emphasis on carefree fun. They still volunteer for Kennett's "After the Bell" children's program, and Mary Ann will continue to spend time with Encore, a consignment store whose proceeds benefit the Chester County Hospital. Art will continue on the board for Luther House, where he helped oversee its construction in 2001. When they're not volunteering, the Knechtels enjoy travelling to the mid-west for Polka festivals; to the New York finger lakes for winery tours with friends; dinner groups and spending time with their children and grandchildren.

As we wrapped lunch, Mary Ann remarked that a quote etched on a glass wall at Kendal spoke to her. "I expect to pass through this world but once. Any good therefore that I can do or any kindness that I can show to any fellow creature, let me do it now. Let me not defer or neglect it, for I shall not pass this way again," by Stephen Grillet. The Knechtels have graced Meals on Wheels with abundant kindness, and for their service we are forever grateful. Bon voyage, Mary Ann and Art!

Be Vigilant

Avoid Medicare Fraud



Medicare fraud and medical identity theft costs taxpayers billions of dollars each year. Medical identity theft happens when someone steals or uses your personal information (like your name, Social Security Number, or Medicare Number) to submit fraudulent claims to Medicare and other health insurers.

Be suspicious of anyone that tells you:

- The equipment or service is free, and they only need your Medicare Number for their records
- Medicare wants you to have the item or service
- They know how to get Medicare to pay for the item or service
- The more tests they provide, the cheaper the tests become

If you suspect Medicare fraud, do one of these:

- Call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227). TTY users can call 1-877-486-2048.
- Call the fraud hotline of the Dept of Health and Human Services at 1-800-HHS-TIPS (1-800-447-8477). TTY users can call 1-800-377-4950.
