Safety and Ride Coordinator – December 2023

Ok, it's time to take a breath. The main part of the season has ended with only a few riding events for the rest of the winter. We have a few things on the schedule, but as always watch our Facebook and e-mails for updates. Don't forget our Christmas party on December 16th. This will take the place of our December gathering. There will be more information from those in charge of the party.

Hope you all can make it!

On November 4th we did have our first non-fire bon fire. Due to the drought we didn't have any open flames but we still packed them in for a fun "end of the season" night. There was lots of food and fun, at least until everyone got cold. M2 tried to get a direct coffee infusion. (See picture)

NEW INFORMATION:

We have been talking about it, now we have time to make it happen. We are scheduling training classes for Chapter members to become better educated in all types of riding situations. Marty has secured a training room at the Salvation Army building at 239 - 3rd Ave E, Hendersonville, NC. The date will be Saturday 01/27/24 at 9:00am. We expect about 4 or 5 hrs. of training. The Chapter will be providing coffee and pastries.

We will be training in probably our most needed course, **Group Riding**. Sure, most people can straddle a motorcycle, point it down the road and throttle up. This class gets more detailed on how to ride with a group of several bikes and the expectations when group riding. The safest way to ride in our group is when everyone follows the same guidelines.

We will also cover **1st on the scene response** regarding accidents and incidents. We will learn how to safely manage the situation, prepare for emergency personnel to arrive and learn how to keep everyone on scene safe.

Riding in the Mountains will be our third topic. We all group ride, ride in the mountains and could be at the scene of an accident. Training is paramount. Fire Departments train, Police Departments train, and the Military train. We as motorcyclists should do the same.

There will also be segments about riding in the cold, riding in the heat, and first aid kit suggestions. We are also looking into First Aid and CPR classes for the future. We are progressively going to train this coming season. Don't just straddle your bike, point it in a direction and twist the throttle.

Speaking of the coming season. Did you like the rides this past summer? Enjoy the ride destinations, attractions, wide variety of types of rides, and Hump Day rides? It was pretty awesome if I say so myself. During the winter months we will have ride committee meetings to come up with a schedule for next year. Everyone is welcome to participate and give suggestions. We usually knock this out with 3 meetings in order to have a paper schedule. We are looking to have short day rides, long day rides, and maybe a couple of long weekend rides. We need suggestions for places to go and things to see. To have a full schedule, it takes a lot of suggestions. We will soon be announcing the location and time for our first meeting.



Don't forget, we meet every Wednesday (Hump Day Ride) for breakfast at Eggs Up Grill on Spartanburg Hwy. If weather permits, we usually have a lunch ride to follow. Destinations are decided on Tuesday based on weather conditions. As the weather is changing, there will be fewer rides planned and they will be shorter and closer to home.

Tech Tip:

Cold weather riding: Yeah, I still do it. I don't do it often, but I will do so for a special event. There is nothing like heated riding gear. I personally have a heated riding jacket, heated riding pants, heated socks and heated glove liners. The brand I have is Gerbings. I have had them for years. They are powered from your bike and will keep you toasty warm. I had tried the bundle up method. It makes you bulky, and it's hard to manipulate your hands. It makes it harder to control your bike and you may still be cold. You're relying on your body heat not escaping the 50mph ride. With heated gear, it literally feels like you put on warm clothes right out of the dryer. There are other brands and I believe they are all good as heated clothing has come a long way. Yes, they can be expensive, but isn't Christmas coming up?

Riding the 3 Flags (Part 2)

So, when does road construction become destruction? The 511 system that many states use is very nice. It can provide great information on road construction, closures, and especially conditions in winter weather. However, several times I have found that the websites may not tell you the extent of the construction. You think of construction delays, etc. as lane closures, resurfacing, maybe some detours.... However, we came across 2 instances outside of the 3 Flags, one in Colorado and another in Montana, where several miles (15-20 in total) of the road had been completely REMOVED!!! What remained was a sketchy mix of dirt, sand, gravel, rock, potholes, and washboard. As much as I dislike high heat, those road conditions were the 2nd worse that I have ever encountered. The worse was several miles of deep mud, 2 up on our 1500 a few years ago in Northern Colorado (but that is another story). Luckily the areas were dry or a dropped bike by one of us was possible as there was no path through the mess and the bikes slid and bounced all over the place. Turning around would have cost us almost half a day, so through we went.




When going on a ride, being able for your family/friends to track your position is great. After checking into some of the satellite tracking devices, which usually cost several hundred dollars and a yearly usage fee, I decided on trying Spotwalla. With Spotwalla, you just create an account, download a free app for your Apple or Android phone, and link the app to your account. The tracking is very cheap, but not free. Kathy and I did a practice track on a summer trip to SE Ohio to ride the Triple Nickel and it worked perfectly. The SCMA also offered a Spotwalla voucher for those with accounts for the 3 Flags, so tracking this trip was free.

The 3 Flags is as much a mental challenge as it is physical. The correct attitude, bike, gear, seat, and comfortable helmet are a necessity, as is an understanding spouse. The 2024 3 Flags will begin in beautiful Hot Springs, BC and end in either Tijuana or Mexicali. Kathy is planning on riding with me next year, which should be a lot of fun as she is a great passenger who doesn't mind an adventure.

Just a few stats from this year (most are estimates). Approximately 200 bikes participated, 12 of which were 2 up. Just under 170 completed the tour on time. Goldwings are the predominant bike of choice, followed by Harleys & Beemers. 19 bikes were piloted by female riders. The youngest rider was a 30 yr. old female from Minnesota on a Victory Cross Country and the oldest was a 92 yr. old man from Nebraska on a Spyder. One female rider was doing her 43rd of the 46 rallies. 6 riders received performance awards (speeding tickets). The oldest and smallest bike to complete the tour was a 1995 BMW K75. A very diverse group of riders and equipment. If you like long distance riding and are ready for a unique adventure, I highly recommend participating in the 3 Flags or one of the other touring rides sponsored by the SCMA like the 4 Corners of the US or the Cabot Trail through Southern Canada.


