On a different note, I finally decided to retire from my profession, it will not be until November or December of this year and I am going to sell my Ponderosa.


















# From the Top Reflections of the Membership Enhancement Coordinator

Tech tip: Take a few minutes and get down to check your bikes brake pads! My bike with 20,000 miles kind of surprised me of their condition. There are 3 sets of pads. Two up front and one in the rear. There are wear guides in the pads. Just because one set might look ok, check them all. On the GL 1800 due to the integrated braking system the left front wears out faster than the rest. If you only look at the back it might be too late on the others. Many of you have bought used bikes and don't really know the maintained history on the bike. It might have passed inspection several months ago but you still need to be pro-active.


