Riding in the Heat Medical Emergencies

Despite the best precautions and preparation, hot weather riding can still produce some very unpleasant conditions.

Dehydration

Symptoms

Dry or sticky mouth

Low or no urine output

□ Concentrated urine appears dark yellow

Not producing tears

□ Sunken eyes

□ Lethargic or comatose (severe dehydration)

Treatment

Seek shade or air conditioning

Drink additional water or specialized sport drinks

Dilute the sport drinks 50/50 with water

D When drinking anything cold and fast, it can give you painful stomach cramps

□ If possible reduce your planned distance and quit early

Heat exhaustion

Symptoms

Loss of large amounts of fluid through sweating

□ Symptoms may resemble early warnings of heat stroke

Heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke

Sweating, clammy and moist skin

□ Pale or flushed complexation

□ Extreme weakness or fatigue

□ Giddiness

Nausea

Headache

□ Irritability

□ Extreme heat exhaustion

□ Vomiting

Possible loss of consciousness

I Treatment

Drink additional water or specialized sports drink

□ Always dilute sports drinks 50/50 with water

□ Apply cool compresses or ice packs to the neck, groin and arm pits

Victims with mild cases of heat exhaustion usually recover spontaneously with treatment.

Heat stroke

□ There is little warning to the victim that a crisis stage has been reached. The body no longer can dissipate heat at all, and severe organ damage may occur.

Symptoms

□ Hot, dry flushed or spotted skin

- Severe headache
- Exhaustion
- Bizarre behavior
- Hallucinations

Altered mental state

Confusion

Disorientation

Possible convulsions and coma

Heat stroke treatment

□ Call EMS (911) immediately

D THIS IS A MEDICAL EMERGENCY!!

□ Unless the victim receives quick and appropriate treatment, death can occur

□ First aid should be immediately administered

□ Reduce patient's body heat immediately by all means possible □

Remove victim to a cool area.
