Chances are you haven't seen me in a while. That's mostly because the January and February gatherings were both by Zoom. We've still been working behind the scenes though. The Helen, GA event has been organized and booked. It's kind of a long story but it's done, thanks to Brian and

We had our second ride meeting with quite a few people involved. The destinations for the year have been set as well as the dates. We are now working on Road Captain's to lead some of the rides. When you see the schedule, which will be out shortly, you will see that Bob Topper, Rusti Boykin and I have already volunteered for more than our fair share. If we can't get Road Captains to sign up for some of the remaining rides they could be subject to being canceled. Speaking of Road Captains, want to be one? We will be looking to get a Road Captain's class set up for sometime this summer. I know of at least 2 members who would like to get more involved as Road Captains.

If you have signed up for the Medic/First Aid class don't forget that it is less than a week away; Saturday March 5th 2022 at the Henderson County Athletics and Activity Center, 708 South Grove Street, Hendersonville. 9:00am people! You probably want to bring a refreshment and a snack.

After the March gathering, which I believe will be back to being in person, we have a ride planned for the Hagood Mills Historical site in Pickens, SC. www.hagoodmillhistoricsite.com. This is a site with an old operating Mill, featuring an 1845 gristmill, restored log cabins, blacksmith shop, cotton gin, moonshiners still, nature trails, and a gift shop featuring local crafters, musicians and authors. There is a cost of \$5.00 per person to see it all.

As Bob Topper mentioned there will be an ice cream ride on the 25th. Then we swinging right into April.

At the beginning of April will be "Tech Day" at the Yager's garage, 112 Mountain Place, Hendersonville. It's set for Saturday April 9th, from 9:00am to 4:00pm. Lunch will be ordered in and you will be responsible for your order. We try to teach each other how to work on the bikes. How to change oil, change spark plugs, and change the dreaded air filter. This year, part of the plan is to change clutch and brake fluid as well as coolant. If you plan to have your bike be a guinea pig, please let me know what you might need done. You will be responsible for your own parts. This is a training day and we may not be able to work on everyone's bike so pay attention so you can work on your own later. We might even get a chance to see how things are on the new 2018 + Goldwing which I have not yet ventured into. Believe me, it's a big day for me just emptying the garage for work space. Remind me and we will demonstrate how to pick up a downed Wing by yourself. We might even have time to add some new sparkle if you bring it.

I know this is a repeat of last month's article but this is important information and I'm somewhat of a safety nut. I encourage you to participate in any level you feel comfortable in. This summer I will be participating in a MSF Rider class that is held at the Blue Ridge Community College in Hendersonville. At the tour meeting, based on other events going on, we settled on Sunday, June 26th for the class. Again my hope is for several of us to sign up for the same class.

This is the Basic Rider II. Class is from 8:00am to 5:00pm rain or shine. The cost is \$85.00 and you need to be pre-registered. Please let me know if you plan to attend so I have a good reference in my head.

Motorcycle Safety - Blue Ridge Community College



- Level I Safety by Commitment
- Level II Safety by Education
- Level III Safety by Preparedness
- Level IV Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

The GWRRA is proud to present the Rider Education Program. We encourage you to think seriously about motorcycle safety and be a participant in the GWRRA Rider Education Program. You should also remember the old cliché, "an ounce of prevention IS worth a pound of cure." Always wear protective riding apparel!

Are you a Trike person? North Carolina District will be holding a Trike course on April 2nd at the Woodland Baptist Church in Waynesville (Near the fairgrounds where WOS is held.) There will be a rain date of April 9th. This is the first Trike course on the Western end that I know of. If you are interested in taking the trike course contact Assistant Ride Director Paul Breau 845-527-2262. He can verify start time and if there is a cost. The TRC course is going to be the outside riding course only.

Tech tip: If you have not already done so, now is the time to really look your bike over for the upcoming season. Get down and look at your tires. How many miles are on them, how soon will they need to be replaced, any cupping on the edges, how deep is the tread, how old is the tire, any cuts, or foreign objects in the tire? I have found a small screw in the tire before it punctured the tire. How does your valve stem look? Does your valve stem still have the support piece for the 90 degree stems? Your air pressure needs to be checked as going from warm weather to cold weather has dropped my pressure, while going back to warm also affects the tire. Check and change your oils, coolant, brake fluids, clutch fluid. We Goldwingers tend to talk to each other about where we had our last great meal or a good ice cream stop but I don't hear many of you tell me that your bike has been serviced. I suspect some have been neglected either for cost or lack of talent in doing the work yourself. This brings us back to Tech Day. You can't afford to miss it.
