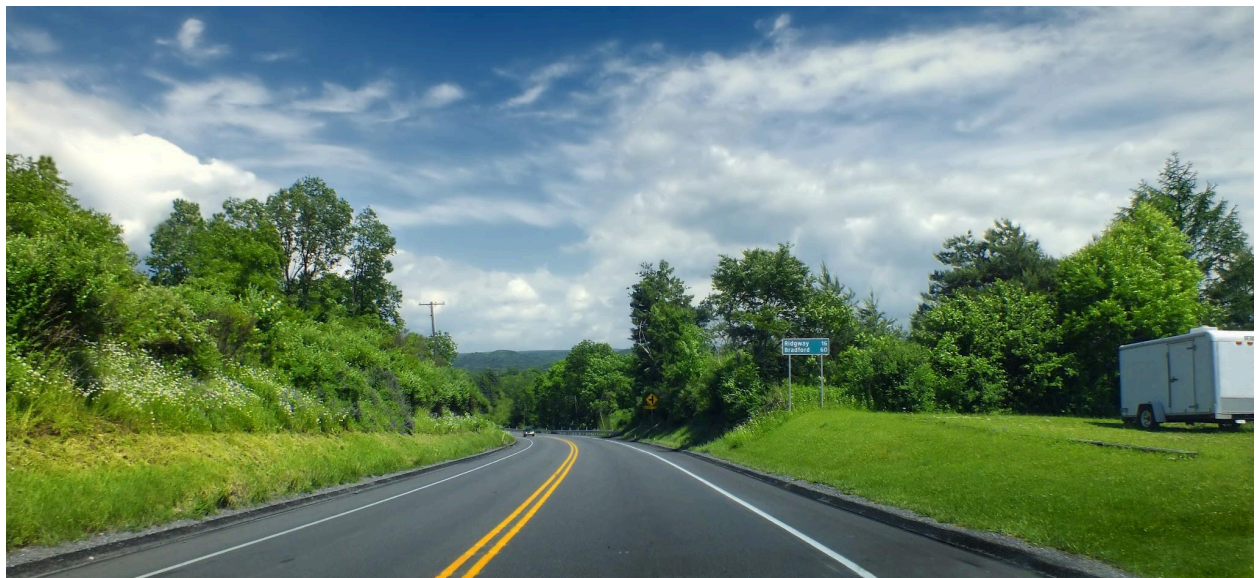

Time to ride:

Riding into Summer: On your mark- get set- GO! Yep, it's here. The beginning of summer and a whole lot of places to see and things to do. It takes some planning on your part but mostly on our part. First up will be the trip to the Barber Museum in Leeds, AL with a side trip to The Space Center in Huntsville, AL. Those that have already signed up for this weekend



trip will be leaving Friday, May 3 rd , from the Ingles on 280 in Mills River. Kickstands up at 9:00am. Brian W. will be leading the ride out from there. Please plan to be slightly early with a full tank of gas and empty bladder as this is one of the longest rides of the summer. (See my Tech tips for long distance riding).

May 17 th and 18 th will be the South Carolina Rally being held in Newberry, SC. On Friday, May 17 th, Chapter Director Marty will be having breakfast at Eggs Up at 8:00am and leading anyone that wants to ride down for the day, leaving EGGS UP at: 8:45am. A day pass is \$20.00. Let Marty know if you plan to join him for the day. Don't forget the Chapter gathering will be on the 18 th . Make sure to be there as we follow up with a ride to Strawberry Hill to get your fix for fresh strawberries. (BTW 2 buckets will fit in the trunk of a Goldwing, tested by me).

Events also going on in May that may be of interest are the Slingshot Rally in Maggie Valley on May 28th through June 1st. May 31 st to June 1 st will be the Hillbilly Hoedown held at Fort Hamby Park, Wilkesboro, NC.

Asheville Tourists game: Have you let Karen Newhall know if you plan to attend the Asheville Tourists game on June 20 th ? It happens to be Thirsty Thursday! We have reserved 20 tickets for the game. We don't ride the bikes but get together for a good time. The location is the McCormick Field in Asheville at 6:00pm. Have a Chapter shirt? We ask that you wear it. Contact Karen at newlarz@yahoo.com to let her know you are coming. Cost is \$14.00 per person. Sullenberger Aviation Museum: If your interest is in transportation, you just might want to make this planned event. This is a brand new museum of aviation located in Charlotte, NC. It opens June 1 st and contains a large

selection of avionic memorabilia including the most famous passenger jet in America. “The Miracle on the Hudson” flight that left New York but was in route to Charlotte when Captain Sullenberger landed the aircraft on the Hudson River saving the lives of every passenger on board. The date is Saturday, October 5th. We meet at 9:00am at the Ingles on Spartanburg Highway and Upward Rd. Our group tour is 12:00pm and will last about 2 hrs. Cost is \$16.50 each (discount from general admission). I have reserved for 20 people and had to put down a deposit to secure the spot. If you have not yet reserved your spot and paid me, please let me know ASAP if you plan to go. I know we still have some time before this happens but this had to be booked. Sullenberger Aviation Museum in Charlotte, NC.

Bike Safe NC: For those that are interested in learning more about riding your motorcycle as safely as possible, some of us are signing up for the Bike Safe program on Friday, August 16th held in Woodfin, north of Asheville. The class is free! It starts at 8:45 am so we will be meeting at the Ingles in Mills River at 7:00am to go there. You must sign up in advance on their website. At this time there are only 4 openings left for that date. So if you have not yet signed up, get it done! BikeSafe North Carolina (bikesafenc.com)

M2 Cookout: The date is Saturday, July 6th. Let Marty know you plan to come. More of this from Marty and Debbie. At the end of the month (last Friday of the month) we will be having our ice cream ride. For the ice cream rides we always meet at Ingles on Spartanburg Highway and Upward Rd at 6:00pm and ride to an ice cream shop that is determined based on time and weather. This happens each last Friday of the month during the summer. These rides are not challenging or long distance rides. It's something for those who aren't attracted to the bigger rides.

Tech Tip: Long distance rides: Our first long distance ride is at the end of the week, on the way to Leeds AL.

Here are a few tips and tricks for the ride. Being prepared is half the battle. Make sure you didn't leave your rain suit in the garage. Chances are you will need it and it really sucks when 5 riders have them and are willing to ride in the rain and you don't but don't want to hold the others up. Be sure to pack for both cold weather and warm weather situations. Have a spare sweatshirt in the saddle bags. I typically keep wet riding gear in

one side and warm riding gear in the other. Do you have a tire plug kit to get you by if you had too? How about an inflator to follow that up with. Did you put together the trauma kits we have been talking about? If not, try to in the next few days. Plan for the heat, to stay hydrated. During the heat I often carry a cup on the handle bars. It's better to have water or a flavored water for hydration than soda or coffee. Take breaks as needed, but the idea for long distance is that the breaks can be spaced apart. Make sure that when the bike with the smallest gas tank needs to be filled, everyone fills up so you don't end up playing hop scotch on gas fill-ups. For long distance rides, change your underwear. Not while you're riding but before. Make sure it's made of a material that wicks moisture. Moisture will make you much more uncomfortable and leave you squirming in your seat. Don't forget the Monkey Butt or Gold Bond powder in the basement. One of my favorite tricks is to have my highway pegs set so that I can put my legs straight out on them lifting my butt off the seat for a few minutes. After settling back down in the seat it feels like you took a break. Stash the wallet. Take your wallet out of your back pocket and stash it in the trunk. I also leave a credit card (with a small credit limit) locked in the gas tank compartment for quick access for fill-ups.
