Safety and Ride Coordinator – March 2025

I have so much to report, we have been working hard on getting things ready for the season. By the time you are reading this, you will have to make several decisions as we have things going on early in the season. We will be Flying High.

April 5th is Tech Day held at the Yager residence from 9:30 AM until about 3:00 PM. This is where you can learn how to service your own motorcycle. Change oil, check your fluids, and Change your air filter, spark plugs. How to read the condition and dates of your tires. How to fix a flat on the side of the road. Every member is invited to attend, participate as you can or just be an observer and learn.

The following Saturday April 12 we will be holding "Training Day". I can't explain how important I feel this is especially for our newer members. We promote ourselves as one of the safest riding groups which comes with some rules. Not sure what they all are? Plan to attend. Topics we will be covering will be Group Riding, Riding in the Mountains, 1st on the Scene, and First Aid kit suggestions. We are also hoping for a seminar for Riding from 2 to 3 wheels. We will be holding this at the Salvation Army located at 239 3rd Ave E, Hendersonville, at 9:00 AM for your doughnuts. Classes begin at 9:30 AM. Never attended one of these classes before? The Sullenberger Aviation Museum tour will be on May 3rd. We will meet at the Ingles on Highland and Spartanburg at 9:00AM for our tour at noon. If you had already signed up and paid, I have your information. We are now able to take on additional people for the tour through April 23rd. Our tour meetings were rather successful and we have decided on the two overnight destinations.

One 4 day weekend event will be a ride to the AMA Motorcycle Museum in Pickerington, OH.

A side trip while there will be to the National Air Force Museum located in Dayton, OH. These destinations are about 460 miles away. Marty is now researching it for more specific information

The second overnight trip will be to Savannah, GA to the Mighty Eight Air Force Museum. Gunner is doing the research on this event. We hold out third tour meeting on March 22nd to finalize the season. Thus the theme of Flying High this season.

At the Ride meeting, out of the dates available for Bike Safe being held in Woodfin / Asheville, as a group we picked Friday June 13th as the day for us to participate as a group. There is no cost to this and great on the road and classroom training as well as creating a relationship with the local Motorcycle Police patrols. There are only 6 positions available and you must sign up on line with them.

In addition to Bike Safe, We are also looking to ride as a group to the MSF Motorcycle Safety Basic II class being held at the Blue Ridge Collage on Sunday June 29th.

This eight-hour course is for the rider with at least six months or 3,000 miles riding experience. Students must possess a valid motorcycle learner's permit* or Motorcycle Endorsement before enrolling. Students will need to furnish a street-legal, properly licensed and insured motorcycle of any size. If the motorcycle is not registered in the student's name, written permission from the owner to use the motorcycle must be furnished. All motorcycles will be inspected for proper and safe conditions with particular attention to tires. If you normally carry a passenger, your passenger will also need to register and pay the 2-Up Passenger fee. This class teaches motorcycle handling in all types of conditions. This is a parking lot course and will help you become one with your motorcycle. There is a cost of \$105.00 each and must be registered online with the college.


