


Show, and the Stair Crest Senior living & Muskego Regency Car Show, not to mention our social supper club dinner drive at Dockside.

GM Has Now Discontinued All Seven Exterior Colors Going Away for 2025

All seven of the exterior colors going away from the Corvette in 2025 are now discontinued and cannot be ordered with these final 2024 order cycles.

The last constraint report at the end of May had Accelerate Yellow and Amplify Orange discontinued, and now they are joined by Carbon Flash Metallic, Silver Flare, Hypersonic Gray, Ceramic Matrix Gray and Cacti.

For the Stingray, no 1LTs can be ordered, and the number of non-Z51 Corvettes are also being limited. There is also limited availability for the Q9I 20-Spoke Gloss Black Wheels.

For Z06, the rumors were true! No T0G or T0F aero packages can be ordered, so that means no Z07s are available to buyers.

This is the final 2024 order cycle, and now we'll have to wait and see if the first 2025 consensus (allocations) comes next Thursday. We've had some conflicting information on all these "end dates" as well as when the first 2025 ordering will happen, so the best thing we can do is just sit back and see what happens! Stay tuned! Trip Around Lake Winnebago - June 2nd



- New Members: Don & Jozie Guay are previous members who joined the MCC in 1994, left the club for a number of years and now have rejoined. Welcome Back!! They have a 1958 Corvette.
- 55 Members attended the June Meeting
- Charity Bucket: \$65

- 50/50 Raffle: \$83.50 went to charity and \$83.50 was won by Mark Kruschke
- Treasurer Report: Bank Balance: \$22,890.45
- Jammin In the Park: Bobby mentioned this was the first year for this event and the first year the MCC was invited to have our Corvettes at this event. Bobby said he was very disappointed in the location where we were told to park our cars, which was on the other side of the City Hall building away from all the other events. The mayor also noticed where we were parked and said next year we would have a prime location. We will have to see if we decide to participate and if there is another Jammin. Bobby thanked and apologized to the MCC members who attended as the lines for beer, drinks and food were terrible. On a positive note, the MCC Car Show Flyer will be in the Chamber of Commerce Booklet that goes out to 4,000 people as the MCC is a member.
- <u>St. Jude's Charity Corvette Drive 2024</u>: Both Fred Anderson and John Klemmer spoke about the 2024 drive. This was the first time for both of them. It was a very rewarding experience. The MCC donated \$1,000 which was turned into a sponsorship for St. Jude's Research Hospital and our logo appeared on banners, booklets, etc. The MCC was well represented. Numerous people found out our group was with the MCC and thanked us for the sponsorship.

Six cars were in the group and they left from John's house and drove through Chicago to Bourbonnais, IL. Next year we will take back roads to avoid Chicago. In Bourbonnais there were 13 Corvettes and two chase cars. Pickup truck was filled with coolers with soda and water, etc. Snacks were also provided. Had a safety meeting and were advised how to drive, where to drive and to stay in left lane. There were five groups of Corvettes that left Bourbonnais and traveled to Dyersburg, TN. Met Mayor of Dyersburg and had dinner.

Two St. Jude families traveled with our group. A dad and his son who was 5 when he had cancer and is now 25 and cancer free. This dad and his son raised \$40,000 themselves. Other family had a daughter who at age 10 had headaches and was diagnoses with a brain tumor. She was treated at St. Jude but passed away at age 25.

Next morning another safety meeting and drove from Dyersburg, TN to Memphis, TN and the St. Jude Campus with 112 Corvettes and 3 miles long. We were escorted by motorcycles from various police agencies. We stayed in the left lane and were the only vehicles on the freeway. All freeway ramps were closed. Motorcycles leap frogged about 100mph past us to close the ramps.

When we arrive at the St. Jude Campus there were hundreds of people (doctors, nurses, parents, patients) ringing cow bells and holding signs saying "Thank You", "We love Corvette Drivers", "We love St. Jude Drivers". Very emotional scene. The patients along with their families never pay a penny for their care, living expenses, etc. Dominos Pizza contributed to the "Domino Center" which is a 7-story apartment building for the families.

Upon arrival we went to a conference room on the 6th floor. There were about 200 plus people (administrators, doctors, nurses, etc.) in the room. The research and protocols St. Jude is doing benefits the entire world. Presented the check from the Corvette Group in the amount of \$510,000. Administrator of fund raising said St. Jude raised \$2.3 billion last year.

After the event, we decided to have lunch at the Bass Pro Shop at the Wahlburgers Restaurant. We found out you can take an elevator all the way to the top of a pyramid. Cost is \$8.00. You can see the river, downtown Memphis, etc. While standing in line wearing our St. Jude shirts, we were told we could go to the front of the line and no charge. When we left for home, we drove north along the Mississippi Great River Road, stayed in Hannibal, MO and went through the Quad Cities to home.

Every participate was given two shirts. One shirt was worn on the drive from Bourbonnais, IL to Dyersburg, TN. Second shirt was worn from Dyersburg, TN to Memphis, TN.

Fred and John will do this again next year. Event is May 15-16, 2025 in Memphis. Will take a different route and leave May 14th at Noon, take a 3¹/₂ to 4-hour drive to Bourbonnais, IL. Dinner at Italian Restaurant. An interesting drive back home is planned should you want to participate.

This was an amazing and humbling experience. The requirements are from the driver \$1,250 and passenger \$750 for a total of \$2,000. Starting on July 1, 2024 you can register online for 2025. There is a \$425 registration fee but you get snacks and drinks along the drive, two shirts per person, gas on the way to Dyersburg, TN, lunch on the way to Dyersburg, dinner with the Mayor in Dyersburg, hotel stay in Dyersburg.

St. Jude Children's Research Hospital was founded in 1962 by Danny Thomas whose parents were Lebanese immigrants. Danny was born in Deerfield, MI. Danny turned to his fellow Americans of Arabic-speaking decent and met in Chicago to form ALSAC (American Lebanese Syrian Associated Charities) with the sole purpose of raising funds for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. His daughter, Marlo Thomas is still involved as is his son, Tony Thomas.

Bobby thanked the members who participated and would like to see a lot more members participate next year



Unfortunately the copy he sent turned out to be of too poor resolution to read even after converting to 1200 pixels per inch. However, having alerted me to the story, I was able to locate the following on the MotorTrend site.

Your Icon of Icons: The Chevrolet Corvette Is the Most Iconic Car of the Past 75 Years "America's sports car" was chosen by you from among 10 of the greatest cars in automotive history.

Was there ever any doubt? MotorTrend readers are largely American, and as much as we love Jeeps, Mustangs, and F-150s in this country, the Corvette has been "America's sports car" for nearly as long as this publication has existed. That's why you chose it via our online vote as the most iconic car of the past 75 years.

Rewind 71 of those years to January 1953 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City, and you



might not have predicted this moment. Interest was strong in GM's new fiberglass-bodied sports car, yes, but with a 150-hp "Blue Flame" inline-six under the hood backed by a two-speed Powerglide automatic, it wasn't exactly the all-conquering automotive hero we know today. Chevrolet built just 300, and even those had trouble finding homes—you could only buy them in white with red interiors, which didn't help the case. The do-it-your-self ragtop and curtain windows that only worked with the roof in place weren't any more enticing when it came time to close a sale.

It was, however, enough to get the attention of an engineer by the name of Zora Arkus-Duntov. Despite his honorary title of "father of the Corvette," General Motors didn't hire Arkus-Duntov until five months after he saw the car at the Motorama show in the Waldorf Astoria ballroom. Legendary GM designer Harley Earl came up with the original idea, his lieutenant Robert McLean styled it, and Chevy R&D boss Maurice Olley engineered it. Within a few years, Olley and Arkus-Duntov had the car straightened out and fitted with the first smallblock Chevy V-8 and a manual transmission, and it was off to the races.




Beyond the cars themselves, fortuitous associations with stardom cemented its place in American pop culture, first as the main characters' car on the popular TV show Route 66—sponsored by Chevrolet, with the company always ready to replace the car at the beginning of each season with an updated model—and by the end of the '60s as the car of the Apollo astronauts.

Chevy's chief engineer, Ed Cole, personally gifted astronaut Alan Shepard a '62 Corvette after he returned from space, and of course all

the other Mercury astronauts and the later Apollo astronauts would want one, too. Florida dealer and previous Indianapolis 500 winner Jim Rathmann offered the national heroes new Corvettes for \$1 each every year until the end of the Apollo program. Many of them had their cars custom painted, and today you can see several at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky. Yes, there's a museum just for historic Corvettes.

The Corvette is everywhere you look in American pop-culture history over the past 75 years. It's been featured in songs by artists ranging from The Beach Boys to George Jones to Sir Mix-a-Lot to, most famously, Prince's 1983 hit "Little Red Corvette." On the small screen, it was Sam Malone's favorite car in Cheers. On the big screen, it's been in everything from Terms of Endearment to the Transformers series to Corvette Summer. Barbie drove a modified first-generation model in her latest blockbuster (an EV conversion with blended



styling cues from '56 and '57), and she's had 26 of them since she picked up her first in 1976. Ken and Barbie's friend Shani has also had one.

On the track, the Corvette has paced the Indy 500 a record 21 times, and the factory-backed Corvette Racing team was utterly dominant at home and abroad. Formed in 1999, it won the 24 Hours of Le Mans nine times, the Rolex 24 Hours of Daytona four times, the American Le Mans Series championship 10 times, the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship five times, and the FIA World Endurance Championship once.



MotorTrend has a hand in the Corvette's legacy, too. We've named it our Car of the Year three times (1984, 1998, and 2020) and Performance Vehicle of the Year once (2023).We've put a Corvette on our cover 114 times over the past 75 years, with 90 of those instances occurring since 1983. We've reported on rumored mid-engine Corvettes since at least 1970. We started the whole Corvette versus Porsche 911 rivalry in the '60s, we were the first to pit a 'Vette against a jet in the '80s, and we did it again in the 2010s. We even spoiled the surprise of the fifth-generation Corvette with an illustration on the cover of our April 1995 issue (the car didn't make its debut until '97) so close to the real thing that it caused a scandal inside GM HQ

and demands to know our source.

We did it again in 2014. A full five years before Chevy revealed the C8, we reported accurately that a midengine Corvette was finally happening. As early as 1959, Arkus-Duntov was already working on a mid-engine car. The first Chevrolet Engineer Research Vehicle—CERV-I—wasn't a Corvette per se, but the mid-engine

race car prototype would be the start of Arkus-Duntov's long and ultimately futile struggle to reimagine the model as a mid-engine sports car. He personally oversaw the construction of the CERV-II race car prototype and six Corvette-bodied mid-engine street car prototypes. Yet 45 years and three more dead-end concepts followed his retirement before the mid-engine C8 Corvette's 2019 debut.

Chevy has sold more than 1.8 million Corvettes over the past 71 years, eight generations, and two powertrain



layouts. They've come with automatic, manual, and dual-clutch transmissions offering anywhere from two to eight ratios. Under the hood of the various production cars and concepts, there have been pushrod inline-sixes, pushrod and dual-overhead-cam V-8s, superchargers, turbochargers, a hybrid system, and even rotary engines. They've been featured in countless movies, TV shows, songs, and magazine covers, and they've been owned by more celebrities than we can list up to and including our current president. They've been everything from racing champions to world-beating supercars to the preferred ride of the white-tank-top-and-gold-chain set and of white New Balance and jorts aficionados everywhere.

More than anything, though, the Corvette is America's sports car, and it's your No. 1 automotive icon of the past 75 years.



Editor note: The following story came to the attention of the editor, and although it was not written by someone any of us might know, it does illustrate what many of might have done during our misspent youth.

Adventures in My High-School-Cool Custom '57 Corvette

I hadn't had my '57 Corvette long before it helped me accumulate a couple of tickets and a one-month license suspension. It was the kind of car that encouraged exuberance, and as a teenager in a car-crazy era, I couldn't get enough of it.

Naturally, I used that enforced break from driving to modify my 'Vette. I started by investing summer-job money in a Duntov cam and a set of solid lifters. Next came a manual gearbox. I couldn't afford to swap in a four-speed, so I settled for a three-speed and paid a mechanic to install it and its clutch mechanism. Then, once my license was restored and the 'Vette



was ready, a friend and I picked it up from the shop and test drove it out of town. We headed for a long, straight stretch of divided parkway with no houses or traffic where someone had painted 1/4-mile start and finish lines on the eastbound side. We wanted to try a fun run, so approaching that section on the westbound side, just cruising in third, I decided to punch it without downshifting to see how it pulled from low rpm. I was watching the road, not the speedometer, but we were likely up to 90 or so (in a 35-mph zone) before I backed off and braked for the stop at the next intersection.



When we got there, a pair of angry cops were waiting. "Do you know how fast you were going, kid?" one growled angrily. "No, officer," I grinned, thinking they had merely heard the engine at high rpm and didn't really have anything on me. I was not about to confess.

"We clocked you at 80," he snarled. "Let me see your license." It turned out they had radar hidden halfway down the road (unusual at the time) and were monitoring it from the corner. "Is that as fast as that car will go?" one officer sarcastically enquired while his partner was writing maybe the best ticket of his career. "Yeah ... in first gear," I snarked.

The Motorama Corvette Competitors

If you didn't know, Chevrolet had planned to do the Corvette in steel after the first year. The use of fiberglass was just a means of getting the car ready at short notice.

In hindsight, it was a good thing Chevrolet did not put off the Corvette until 1954 to go with the steel body. As reviews started coming in for the 1953 Corvette and stories circulated about the car's underwhelming performance, fit, and finish, interest quickly diminished. By the end of the 1954 production run, only 3,650 Corvettes were ordered, way off the 10,000 projected units. The public did not yet grasp the sports car concept and took a major chill to Chevy's sports car, so much so that only 700 1955 Corvettes were sold! The new 265 small block didn't help. If Chevrolet had gone with a steel body, with those kinds of reviews, and sales, they would have immediately killed the Corvette.

The dynamic 1953 Motorama Corvette, with its sexy, hi-tech "fiberglass plastic" body seriously got the attention of GM's other car divisions; Pontiac, Buick, and Oldsmobile. When the doors to the 1954 GM Motorama event opened, the other GM divisions had their version of the Corvette. But by then, it was just a dog-and-pony show. The Pontiac Bonneville Special, the Buick Wild Cat-II, and the Oldsmobile F-88 were clearly take-offs of the svelte Corvette.

In recent years some writers, having recently discovered those other GM Motorama cars, have concluded; "What was Chevy thinking? These cars would have clobbered the Corvette!" Not so. Each car was overdesigned, slathered with chrome, powered by big V8s, and dripping with futuristic features that would have pushed their price to hyper-expensive Cadillac Eldorado territory.
