

September's Battle of Chickamauga





On September 19–20, 1863, Braxton Bragg's Army of Tennessee defeated a Union force commanded by General William Rosecrans in the Battle of Chickamauga. After Union troops pushed the Confederates out of Chattanooga previously, Bragg called for reinforcements and launched a counterattack near Chickamauga Creek. Over two days of battle, the rebels forced Rosecrans to give way, with heavy losses on both sides. Bragg failed to press his advantage after the victory, however, allowing the Federals to safely reach Chattanooga. Ulysses S. Grant arrived thereafter with reinforcements, allowing the Union to reverse the results of Chickamauga and score a lasting victory in the region that November.

NOTABLE SEPTEMBER



September 3, 1861: Confederate General Leonidas K. Polk occupies parts of Kentucky to prevent Union occupation of strong points.

- -September 5, 1861: Confederate Laird rams, ships being built in Liverpool, England, for the Confederacy, are detained by the British.
- -September 10, 1863: Little Rock, Arkansas, falls to Union forces.
- -September 19, 1864: The Battle of Opequon, the first engagement in Sheridan's Shenandoah Valley campaign, marks the beginning of the "Burning" of the Shenandoah Valley.
