#### 1861

July 21 - First Battle of Bull Run (Manassas) takes place. Being the first major land battle of the war, it signaled that the war would be much longer and bloodier than initially anticipated.

#### 1862

July 1 - The Battle of Malvern Hill

July 12 - Confederate Calvary (Morgan's Raiders), led by General John Hunt Morgan Launched the first raid at, capturing Lebanon, Kentucky

July 13 - Confederate General Nathan Bedford Forrest captured the Union garrison at Murfreesboro, Tennessee

July 15 - The Confederate ironclad CSS Arkansas successfully passed through combined Union fleets on the Yazoo River

#### 1863

July 1 - The Battle of Gettysburg began; led by General Robert E. Lee

July 4 - Confederate forces surrender Vicksburg Mississippi delivering a major blow to gaining control of the Mississippi River.

July 4 - Confederates launched an unsuccessful and costly attack on Helena, Arkansas.

July 8 - Union forces captured Port Hudson, Louisiana, completing the Union's control of the Mississippi River.

July 8 - Confederate General John Hunt Morgan crossed the Ohio River into Indiana ultimately leading to eventual capture.

July 10 - The Siege of Fort Wagner in Charleston Harbor, SC begins.

July 26 - Confederate General John Hunt Morgan is captured as a result of his failed raid

#### 1864

July 11 - Confederate General Jubal Early led his forces into Maryland, approaching within 5 miles of Washington, D.C., in an attempt to relieve pressure on Lee's army. After the skirmish and with no serious assaults on Fort Stevens, Early withdrew into Virginia.

July 22 - The Battle of Atlanta; Confederate forces defending the city under General John Bell Hood were defeated by Union forces under William T. Sherman.

July 30 - The Battle of the Crater begins; a Union attempt to break the Confederate lines at Petersburg, Virginia, using a mine failed disastrously.

We are also working with local organizations to help promote and protect Southern History!


