Constitution of the Confederate States

ADOPTED MARCH 11, 1861

Earlier in February 1861, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas met in Montgomery, Alabama and drafted the Constitution of the Provisional Government of the Confederate States of America which was formally adopted by the Confederate States in March.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

CONFEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA.

We, the people of the Confederate States, each state acting in its sovereign and independent character, in order to form a permanent federal government, establish justice, insure domestic tranquility and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity—invoking the favor and guidance of Almighty God—do ordain and establish this constitution for the Confederate States of America.



Luck of the Irish

Irish Confederate ties

Americans fought for the Confederacy. On the Southern side, Irish-Americans, including their Catholic bishops and priests, sympathized with the defense of the South against Northern aggression, although they also generally supported the institution of slavery. Interestingly, "The Bonnie Blue Flag" was written by Irish-American minstrel Harry McCarthy, later a prisoner of war held at Johnson's Island, Ohio.





Dixie

"Dixie" was written by Irish-American entertainer <u>Daniel Decatur Emmett</u>, born in Mount Vernon, Ohio. The catchy tune soon turned the song into one of the most popular patriotic songs in the Confederacy. Emmett was not happy that his tune was adopted by the south. Even Lincoln recognized the song's power and, at the end of the war, attempted to reclaim "Dixie" as an American, rather than Confederate, song. The tune received an

unofficial endorsement when it was played at Confederate President Jefferson Davis's inauguration in February 1861. The Confederate government never formally endorsed "Dixie," though Davis did own a music box that played the song and is rumored to have favored it as the South's anthem.

Sons of Erin Confederate Irish Flag

This is a flag of the 10th Tennessee Regiment. Because of the large number of Irishmen in the unit the 10th was called the Sons of Erin (Erin meaning Ireland). It was called the Bloody 10th because of its casualties at the Battle of Ft. Donelson, about 50 miles northwest of Nashville. It fought to the end of the war, engaging in many brutal battles including Vicksburg. This flag was sewn by the Ladies Soldiers Friend Society of Nashville. It was green and gold, with an Irish harp. It has the embroidered words "Sons of Erin" and "Go Where Glory Waits You."



March Notable dates in history

March 3, 1863 – USA passes first Federal Draft Act.


March 6, 1861 – CSA calls for 100,000 volunteers.

March 11, 1861 - Permanent CSA Constitution adopted.

March 31, 1863 – CSS Nashville, attempting to run blockade, sunk in Savannah River

Restoring Ft. Bragg

Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth has approved reverting the name of military base Fort Liberty back to Fort Bragg. Hegseth approved a memorandum on Monday to change the name, but with a different namesake. Located just west of Fayetteville, the base was initially named after Confederate Gen. Braxton Bragg. It's one of the largest military installations in the world by population, with more than 52,000 military personnel. A naming commission set up by Congress to study rename military bases described Bragg as "considered one of the worst generals of the Civil War" and "widely disliked in the pre-Civil War U.S. Army and within the Confederate Army by peers and subordinates alike."

Congress proposed renaming the installation and eight other bases during President Joe Biden's tenure. The Fayetteville base's name was changed to Fort Liberty in June 2023 following a congressional decision to rename installations honoring Confederate generals. The efforts were part of the National Defense Authorization Act passed at the end of the first Trump administration. Then-President Donald Trump vetoed the bill, but Congress voted 81-13 to override the decision in January 2021. Hegseth on Monday instructed the Army to revert back to the Bragg name, but paying tribute to a different individual: Pfc. Roland L. Bragg, a World War II veteran "who earned the Silver Star and Purple Heart for his exceptional courage during the Battle of the Bulge," according to defense department press secretary John Ullyot. "This change underscores the installation's legacy of recognizing those who have demonstrated extraordinary service and sacrifice for the nation," Ullyot said in a statement. The action to return the bases to their former Confederate names would require approval from Congress.

It would also require millions of dollars for signage. The cost of changing the base signage from Bragg to Liberty less than two years ago was pegged at more than \$6 million. It's unclear how much this change might cost. U.S. Rep. Richard Hudson (NC-09) <u>praised</u> the announcement, sharing on social media: "Fort Bragg is BACK! Thank you, @SecDef!" Hegseth, a National Guard veteran and former Fox News host, has previously voiced strong opposition to removing the names of Confederate generals from military bases, calling the efforts "a sham," "garbage," and "crap" in various media appearances between 2021 and 2024, according to <u>CNN</u>.



JAMES DONALD MCCURRY, JR.






"IRONMAN"

JAMES DONALD MCCURRY, JR., 62, OF SOUTH PITTSBURG, TENNESSEE WAS CALLED HOME TO BE WITH HIS LORD AND SAVIOR ON THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2025. ON MARCH 1, 1962, JAMES WAS BORN TO THE LATE JAMES DONALD MCCURRY, SR. AND PATSY REYNOLDS MCCURRY. HE WAS A MEMBER OF KIMBALL TABERNACLE OF PRAISE. JAMES WORKED FOR LODGE MANUFACTURING AND WAS A MEMBER OF THE SONS OF CONFEDERATE VETERANS AND THE COPPERHEADS. HE WAS A BIG CIVIL WAR COLLECTOR AND ALSO DID REENACTMENTS. JAMES WAS A HUGE FAN OF MARION COUNTY FOOTBALL AND HELPED THE COACHES DURING GAMES AND PRACTICES.






FINALLY, WE ALL MET WITH BEAR TO PRESENT HIM WITH HIS BOTTOM ROCKER.






