From the Pastor . . . Life is filled with milestones and most or tnem are measured by time. September marked a milestone for Patty and I as we celebrate serving Christ Community Church for five years. That means we've worshiped together roughly 250 times. And we've seen many wonderful blessings here at CCC throughout these five years. We've seen the church grow from roughly 28-30 when we arrived to over 50 on a Sunday morning when everyone is able to attend. We've launched a live-streaming ministry that has reached far beyond the four-walls of the church. We've officiated a couple of weddings and sadly a few more memorial services. We even survived a flood.

One thing I've done personally whenever I reach a five-year milestone is to take stock of things and see where I am, what I should do next, and what do I need to get there. In the case of the ministry work the Lord has called me to here, I've been doing a similar thing. The Lord has been answering my prayer throughout this time and I look forward to what He may have in store.

- Robb Storm said missions groups take a % of all donations to missionaries through the organization, so it's more beneficial to the missionaries to receive donations directly.



Healing Prayer meetings on Tuesday evenings have ended at the home of Debbie and Buddy Laws. Thank you for all your wonderful hospitality over the years!



Be courageous and


know His strength is enough.


HALLOWEEN PARADE OUTREACH

MORE THAN WEEDS CLASS, September 2025

Calendula

At the September 2025 More than Weeds class, participants learned about the "Queen of skin care herbs" Calendula. As always, the class was divided into 2 sections.



Part one of the class was lecture followed by questions and answers. Students learned about the uses for Calendula and the different methods for delivery of the healing components of this wonderful plant. Part two of this class was lab. Students learned

about salves, butters, balms, tinctures and liniments. A recipe for creating a Protective Calendula Butter Bar was presented and students watched and participated in creating this skin protecting butter bar just in time for hard working hands that are preparing the gardens for winter and later in the season as a powerful protectant against the harsh and drying winter weather.

Golden Rod

During this time of year many people find their seasonal allergies ramping up. Participants learned to make a tea that may soothe seasonal allergy symptoms.

I have found that many times the plant Golden Rod is blamed for the symptoms that people suffer. However, Golden Rod is usually *not the culprit, it's most often Ragweed which is blooming around the same time that is responsible for the discomfort. You see, Golden Rod has pollen that is too heavy to be dispersed by the wind and spreading its pollen to other plants. That is one very good



reason to not destroy plants like Golden Rod. Our pollinators are dependent on it as a food source.


DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE PEACE OF JERUSALEM



INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE PEACE OF JERUSALEM - 10/5/2024

There is only one city in the entire world to which God has tied His very Name – the city of Jerusalem. Because it is the geographical center for God's Kingdom, the call to pray fervently for Jerusalem is declared throughout Scripture, until the prayer's completion when Jerusalem becomes a praise in the earth.

"Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: they shall prosper that love thee." Psalm 122:6, KJV



The following prayers are from Chosen People Ministries:

A Prayer against Any Antisemitism among Palestinians

Lord, we thank You for Your love and generosity to people of every nation, having made us all in Your image and offering eternal life in Your Son (Genesis 1:28; John 3:16). Amid the pain and anger caused by the conflict, we fervently pray against any form of antisemitism among Palestinians.

Father, convict the hearts of any who harbor hatred toward

Jewish people and draw those people to repent. We pray for healing from hate and for love and peace between Palestinians and Israelis. May compassion prevail, promoting dialogue and understanding between Israelis and Palestinians. Above all, we pray both groups reconcile to God and one another in the Messiah (Ephesians 2:11–22). Amen.

A Prayer against Any Anti-Arab Sentiments among Israeli Jewish People

Lord, we likewise lift our voices in prayer against any anti-Arab sentiments arising among Israeli Jewish people in the midst of this conflict. We pray you replace all hatred or bigotry with love. Bring conviction, repentance, and restoration where needed. May Jewish Israelis come to know the Messiah and embrace His love for all the nations (Acts 10:34–35).

Abba, we ask for forgiveness, reconciliation, and healing conversations. May Your people be the kingdom of priests and holy nation You called them to be (Exodus 19:6). Amen.

A Prayer for Those in the Middle East to Know the Messiah

Father, we pray for all peoples in the Middle East to put their trust in the Messiah Jesus. Lord, open their eyes to reveal who Jesus is and their need for Him. Especially during this crisis, we fervently pray for the people of the Middle East to encounter the transformative love of Jesus, the Messiah.

Amid the turmoil and uncertainty, may individuals on all sides find solace, hope, and eternal salvation in Him. Let the gospel message touch the hearts of Israelis, Palestinians, and all those affected by the conflict.

We pray for a divine outpouring of the Holy Spirit to bring people to faith in Jesus and bring ultimate peace. May He be a source of strength, comfort, and healing to those who are suffering, both in Israel and Gaza. Amen.







