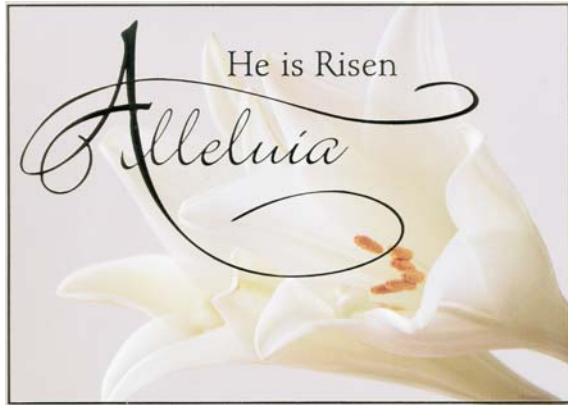

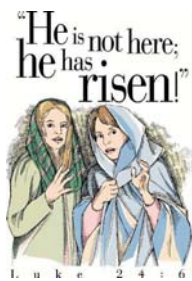

### From the Pastor . . .

By the time you read this our celebration of the resurrection of our Lord will have passed. But, that does not mean that the celebration must end! The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most profound event in all of history. His resurrection was attested to—under penalty of death—by many. He appeared to many for a period of 40 days. Paul tells us He appeared to over 500 people! So we can say with utmost confidence that He is risen! He is risen indeed!

And what great hope that gives us. For it is our faith that He is the Son of God and the belief that we hold that He indeed rose from the dead that we can trust that we too, by the same power, will be raised from the dead and that will happen on the last day (John 6:54). We also have the evidence of the indwelling Holy Spirit whom Jesus sent. His mere presence in our hearts also gives us reason for great hope that all the promised Jesus made will come to pass.



We can now rejoice with Job who said, “For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last He will stand upon the earth. **PASTOR'S ROUNDTABLE RECAP - 3/24**

*(Some items covered separately in this newsletter.)*

- ♦ **FINANCIAL** - We have replaced the \$20,000 previously borrowed from the investments account by the checking account during a lean time.
  - February income \$10,462; expenses \$20,745 (including snow removal and oil.) We changed companies for snow removal: 22-23 season \$18,600 vs. 23-24 season \$10,900. We also used 100 less gallons of heating oil vs. lastseason with our new furnace. .
  - Checking account balance is currently \$27,600. We will be moving more funds around shortly, per the approved items discussed at the Annual Meeting.
- ♦ **MID-WEEK DEVOTIONS** - Videos accessible now online via Facebook and CCC website.
- ♦ **TRACTS & CHURCH INVITE CARDS** - There is a variety of tracts available for outreach, as well as some Lee Strobel booklets. They have also been mailed to online folks and CCC shut-ins.
  - Passion Week readings are also available.
- ♦ **SCRIPTURE MEMORY CARDS** - Laura Salch has made up some small Scripture Memory Cards with the verses that we are being encouraged to memorize. See her if you would like some.
- ♦ **UPCOMING SUNDAY SPEAKERS** - Elder Kevin Salch will give the Sunday message on April 7.
  - Elder Rob Storm will give the message on April 14.
 Pastor Chris and Patty will be in Philadelphia for a special service at their previous church.
- ♦ **ANOTHER SOFTWARE CHANGE** - We had switched from Faithlife to Servant Keeper after Faithlife dropped web hosting and related services. Now we've been having problems with Servant Keeper (such as gmail accounts not receiving CCC emails, etc.) and their Customer Support has not been helpful. We're now switching to ChurchTrac for church accounting and website hosting. It is designed by pastors and ministry leaders. Pricing is half that of Servant Keeper, too. See Patty's article on pg. 5.

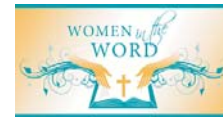
**MEN'S DINNER FELLOWSHIP**

## HOW TO MEMORIZE SCRIPTURE: 5 EFFECTIVE TIPS

Use the following steps to aid in memorizing Scripture. These methods are not the only way, or only order to utilize them in, but simply methods meant to aid us in writing more of God's Word on our hearts than we ever thought possible. It's amazing how, at just the right moment, a verse I forgot I had even internalized will rush to the front of my mind when I need it!



### 1. Read/Listen to the Bible

Start by reading a devotional plan, looking up popular verses to memorize ..., and pray daily for God to provide wisdom to know where to start. Reading the Bible can seem overwhelming at first, but when it becomes a daily habit, a supernatural spark is lit. We begin to experience how God connects the Bible to our daily lives, and personally connects with us through it.

Trying different translations of the Bible until a particular version resonates and relates specifically can be helpful. As can audio versions of the Bible and apps which read Scripture aloud to us.

When a passage or verse begins to stand out, or we find a piece of God's truth to help us through a specific struggle we are experiencing, start by reading it several times a day. Pull the complete sentence(s) rather than short fragments of Scripture. Read the text before and after the verse(s) chosen to memorize for context. Knowing who penned that particular piece of Scripture, what they were going through at the time, and who their audience was, can help us solidify the truth we are attempting to memorize.

### 2. Speak Scripture Aloud

For some it may be awkward to speak Scripture out loud, but it's worth the effort! Speaking God's Word has literal power! Isaiah wrote, "so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11). And Paul wrote to the Philippians of the power in speaking Jesus' name!

Take a walk or a bike ride down a trail and repeat the Scripture over and over. Even on a quiet front porch morning, we can whisper or mouth the words, or close our eyes and visualize our voices speaking the verses. Having a small group of people to hold us accountable is very helpful! Even one friend, family member or neighbor who will listen and help hold us to the exact prose aids the process.

One of the ways we care for others is studying God's Word together. Galatians 6:2 reminds us to "carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."

### 3. Write Out Bible Verses

Grab a journal, a notebook or piece of paper, and write down the specific verse or piece of text every day. If it's a long piece of Scripture, consider writing (and reading and reciting aloud) one verse or one section each day, or for a few days. For longer passages it takes me, personally, a week or so of writing one line or paragraph each day before I have a good handle on it to add more.

When the text is new, copy it word for word or line by line. Then, as the days go by, try to write as much from memory as possible. When finished, look back for mistakes, correct them and re-write them. God honors our daily efforts to internalize His Word, grow closer to Him, and learn more about His character. And the Holy Spirit, present in every believer as gifted to us by Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, aids us in recalling God's Truth.

### 4. Place Scripture Purposefully

Our daily lives are packed with full calendars and overflowing with busyness. Purposefully placing Biblical passages throughout our daily routines helps the memorization process. We can place these in the car, by the coffee, our bathroom mirrors, or the refrigerator door. Post it in the everyday places that our eyes naturally gaze upon.

Those of us who are creative may enjoy completing adult coloring cards of Bible verses or perhaps crafting our own. We can write out beautiful versions or find plenty of free printables online. Strategically placed reminders throughout our days help us to keep God's Word top of mind. As they become easier to remember, we can pause to recite the verses(s) aloud, eventually without gazing at the reminders. Small steps of obedience can make a big impact when memorizing Scripture.

### 5. Wear it

Every time my children sign up for an activity or reach a goal, there's a matching t-shirt or piece of memorabilia to commemorate it. Though just physical things, they represent accomplishment, fulfilled commitment, and hard work! The same idea can help us retain Scripture we either have or are attempting to internalize.

Hats, t-shirts, bracelets, bandannas, water bottle stickers – we can find Scripture written on just about anything and everything! If these reminders seem affordable, fun, and helpful, they can't hurt! However, they are not necessary to memorize God's Word. It's just one more way to remind ourselves of the truth we've worked so hard to write on our hearts.

## 15 SCRIPTURE MEMORY TIPS FROM AWANA CHRISTIAN YOUTH MINISTRY

1. Create pictures to represent the words of the verse.
2. Put the verse to music.
3. Give the verse a title: The Good News Verse, The Heaven Verse: The Beginning Verse ...
4. Use your camera phone to video your child saying the verse.
5. Write out the verse. Cut into pieces (a word to each piece) and have the child put the pieces back together.
6. Give each clubber a different word of the Scripture (on a piece of paper) and have them get into order. You could do this with teams and see which team can get into order the quickest.
7. Give each clubber a card with each day of the week marked on the card. Each day that the clubber studies his/her verses for 10 minutes or more, the parent signs the card. Completed cards (at the next club meeting) earn a prize or extra points.
8. Write out (or enter into the computer) the verses every day for a week.
9. Say the verse and skip a word – clubbers must tell you which word is missing.
10. Make dry-erase boards (old frames with glass work well). Clubbers can make the background picture and use the front of the glass as a dry-erase board.
11. Encourage the clubbers to enter their verses on their phones and look at them once an hour or at 4:00 or when a train goes through town or a plane flies overhead.
12. Read the verse, emphasizing different words. This works especially with younger children – they will actually memorize your tone of voice and your word emphasis which makes it easier for them to memorize.
13. Assign a different word to each clubber. Go around the room with each clubber saying her word. Do it faster and faster. Change starting points so clubbers have different words.
14. Sit in a circle. Throw a bean bag to a clubber who says the first word of the verse and then throws it to someone else who says the second word, etc.
15. Challenge a clubber to teach the verse to an adult.

**TECH TIME - NEW SOFTWARE**



For those that may have heard Pastor Chris, or if you missed the Roundtable, the Elders gave approval to switch from Servant Keeper to ChurchTrac. From what I've been able to see, it's much easier than Servant Keeper in many ways. The goal of ChurchTrac is to be everything a church needs in one software company. It was founded, maintained by pastors.

Some of the features are 3 different types of messaging: email, text, and voice. Voice messaging will allow us to leave a voice message on your landline phone for those that don't receive text messages. The online giving looks easier, and every time I've had a question their support has answered within 30 minutes.

As I learn more about this software, I will put more information in the newsletter. There is a member portal that will allow you to update any of your information and see your contribution statements also! When I am ready I will offer time to meet with anyone, or small groups at a time - features and how to use this new software. Let me know if you are interested to know more and we can set something up.
