Notes:

Several authors have commented that the song evokes the tradition of erecting a crèche, or even a small town containing a crèche, to honor the Christ Child. Some have also given inspiration to the creation of the song from a painting by Georges de La Tour (1593 - 1652) in the 17th Century which depicted a Nativity scene where two young girls quietly watch the Infant. No source has specified which painting this is; perhaps it is "Le Nouveau-Né" (a.k.a. "The New Born" or "The Newborn"), a copy of which may be seen at the [Web Gallery of Art](#), [The Art Renewal Center](#), and [Olga's Gallery](#), who gives the date as circa 1645.
