
WELCOME TO THE **CHRIST COMMUNITY NEWSLETTER!**



HEALING PRAYER MEETINGS




Healing Prayer meetings usually happen at the home of Debbie and Buddy Laws on Tuesday evenings. There will be no meetings in August.

August 2025

At the August 2025, "More Than Weeds" class, participants will learn about a very little known but powerful

plant with the botanical name; (Impatiens Capensis) aka "Jewel Weed" or "Spotted Touch Me Not". The jewel weed plant is very specific for clearing up a poison ivy rash but is effective at treating other types of contact




dermatitis rashes, insect bites and stings. Participants will learn 2 different recipes that will provide different ways to use this valuable little plant.

We will make a liniment (come to class to find out what a liniment is) and a salve. The beauty of a liniment is that it is shelf stable and will last almost indefinitely. The salve, when stored in the refrigerator, will have an increased life of about 6 months.

My husband is highly allergic to poison ivy. In the past when trying to treat a poison ivy rash he has gone from over the counter preparations to prescribed creams and ointments to cortisone pills. Usually taking 3-4 weeks to get the rash to resolve. But, he has found that with quick treatment, at the first sign of a poison ivy rash he has been able to resolve the rash within a week and usually no more than 3-4 days using the jewel weed salve or tincture. This is a wonderful addition to our herbal medicine cabinet, and we use it all the time.

At this class you will receive 2 recipes utilizing jewel weed, Debbie will demonstrate how to make the salve and liniment, and you will go home with samples of both products. Please, if you would like to attend, either call the church and give them your name or simply call Debbie and let her know directly that you will attend her class. That way we are sure to have enough of all the ingredients to give generous samples to all who attend.


