

2020 BY THE NUMBERS

We held a total of 17 programs all at various lengths. We had 311 unique participants with 289 times of veteran participation and 1,492 times of nonveteran participation.

We attended 101 community events of which 2 were tabled events and 15 had us as the main speaker.

We did one week of CIT (all that was offered).

We trained 10 students at PHSC to run on campus groups.




We ran 5 groups for TBH.

We received 830 adult and 100 youth text messages. We sent happy mail to 12 participants, gave 100 treat bags to mental health frontline workers, had 9 virtual art participants, 154 MHM thought participants. All for a total of 1,205 Covid response hits.

We gave holiday gifts to 98 participants.

We had 38 volunteers serve a total of 666.5 hours.




