#### **Sewer Announcement**

PLEASE!!!!! WE ARE ASKING AGAIN -

TOILET PAPER IS THE ONLY THING TO FLUSH DOWN TOILETS!!

We had a recent situation caused by various inappropriate materials (wipes for any purpose, women's hygiene items, mop heads, diaper type products, etc.) being flushed down the toilets that clogged up the pumps and the check valves at the lift station that transfers the waste to the Portage sewage faciltiy. This created material flow and metering problems which we are required to report to Portage Utilities for billing. The subsequent repairs and excess fees from the City of Portage have cost all of us approximately \$20,000. It is bad enough that the City just increased sewage fees by 25% and will continue to raise the rate over the next 4-5 years, but when we have people flushing things down the system that cause this type of issue...we all pay for this irresponsible behavior.

REPEAT: THE ONLY MATERIAL THAT SHOULD BE FLUSHED DOWN THE TOILET IS TOILET PAPER!!! THANK YOU!!
