NHL/NHLPA First Shift Program: A New Opportunity

We're thrilled to announce that Mission Minor Hockey has been accepted into the NHL/NHLPA First Shift program, sponsored by Bauer and Hockey Canada, for the 2025-26 season! A huge shout out to Doug Bodner for getting our application in and being accepted. This learn-to-play initiative is designed to introduce kids aged 6-10 who have never played hockey to the sport in an accessible, affordable, and fun way. For a \$299 registration fee, participants receive a full set of Bauer equipment (fitted by experts and theirs to keep), six on-ice sessions with fun drills, and Hockey Canada-provided insurance. The program kicks off with a Welcome Event, where families meet coaches, learn about equipment, and get fitted. On-ice sessions, held at the same time and rink each week, focus on fundamental skating and hockey skills in a supportive environment with a 1:4 instructor-to-skater ratio. The First Shift program aims to remove barriers like equipment costs and intimidation, fostering a love for hockey. After the six weeks, our Transition Program will offer a path
