Virtue of fasting on the first 10 days of Dhul Hijjah

There are no days more beloved to Allah Ta'ala in which he is worshipped, than the first ten days of Dhul Hijjah. The fast of each of these days is equal to the fast of a whole year, and the worship of each of these nights is equal to the worship of Laylatul Qadr.

Note:



Laylatul Qadr has been mentioned in the Holy Qur'an to be more virtuous than one thousand months. Laylatul Qadr is found on one of the odd nights of the last ten days of Ramadhan.

Takbir Al-Tashriq

Allahu Akbar, Allahu Akbar.
Laa Ilaha Illallahu wallahu Akbar.
Allahu Akbar wa Lillahil Hamd.

Translation

Allah is the Greatest. Allah is the Greatest.
There is none worthy of worship
except Allah and Allah is the Greatest.
Allah is the Greatest and all praises
are for Allah alone.



The Time for Takbir Al-Tashriq

It is necessary to recite the Takbir Al-Tashriq after every fardh salah, from the Fajr of the 9th of Dhul Hijjah to Asr of 13th of Dhul Hijjah. This is a total of 23 salahs.

$$1 \text{ (9th Fajr)} + 4 \text{ (Rest of 9th)} + 5 \text{ (10th)} + 5 \text{ (11th)} + 5 \text{ (12th)} + 3 \text{ (13th)} = 23 \text{ Salahs}$$



Remember:

Takbir Al-Tashriq begins after every fardh salah, starting from the Fajr of the 9th of Dhul Hijjah and ends after the Asr of the 13th of Dhul Hijjah.

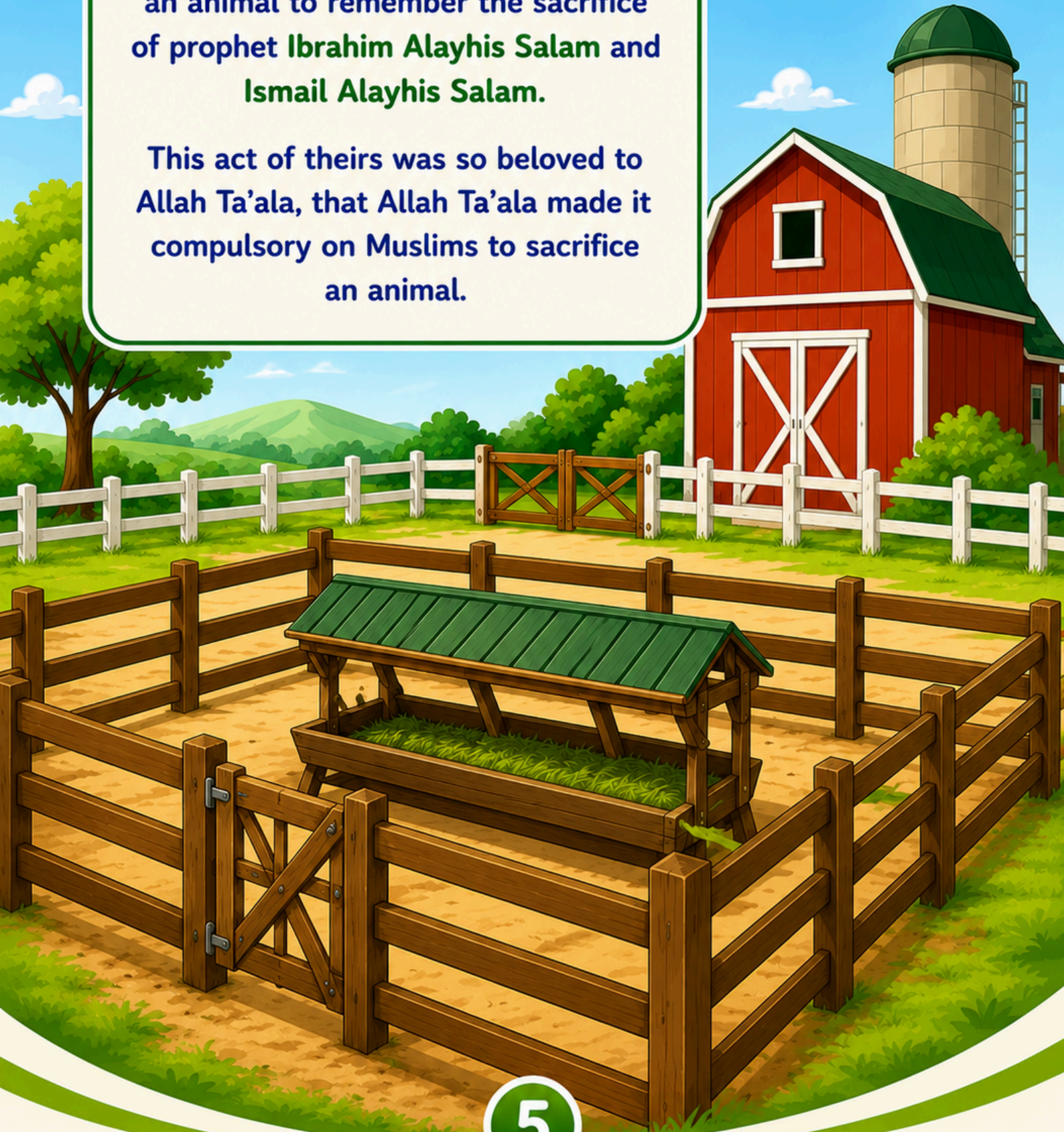


Men will recite it loudly and women will recite it quietly.

Qurbani

During Eid-ul-Adha, we slaughter an animal to remember the sacrifice of prophet **Ibrahim Alayhis Salam** and **Ismail Alayhis Salam**.

This act of theirs was so beloved to Allah Ta'ala, that Allah Ta'ala made it compulsory on Muslims to sacrifice an animal.



The Virtue of Qurbani



Once the sahabah Radiallahu anhum asked our beloved prophet Muhammad Sallallahu alaihi wasallam why do we do Qurbani.



Our beloved prophet Muhammad Sallallahu alaihi wasallam informed them that it is the Sunnah of Prophet Ibrahim Alayhis Salam.



Then they asked about the virtue of Qurbani.



Our beloved prophet Muhammad Sallallahu alaihi wasallam said you will get a reward for every hair on the animal which you have sacrificed.



Then the Sahabah Radiallahu anhum asked about an animal which has wool.



Our beloved Muhammad Sallallahu alaihi wasallam said that they will receive a reward for every fibre of wool which is on the animal.

Animal Hair



Every hair on the animal for which you sacrifice, you will get a reward from Allah Ta'ala.

Wool (Fibre)



Every fibre of wool on the animal for which you sacrifice, you will get a reward from Allah Ta'ala.

The Time for Qurbani

The time for Qurbani begins after Eid Salah on the **10th** of Dhul Hijjah and ends at sunset on the **12th** of Dhul Hijjah.

These days (10th, 11th and the 12th of Dhul Hijjah) are known as **Ayyaamun Nahr** (the days of slaughtering).

1

To wake up earlier than usual

2

Brush the teeth with a Miswaak

3

Have a ghusl (bath)

4

Dress in one's best clothes, not necessarily new. We should dress in an Islamic manner.

5

Use Itr

6

Perform Eid Salah at the Eidgaah

7

Avoid eating before Eid salah

8

Go to the place of salah early

9

Walk to the place of Eid salah (if it is within walking distance)

10

Recite the Takbir Al-Tashriq aloud on the way to the place of Eid salah.

11

Use different routes to and from the place of Eid salah
