




Lesson 2

The night of Bara'ah

15th night of Sha'ban

Sha'ban is the 8th Month of the Islamic calendar. There is a night in the Month of Sha'ban called the night of Bara'ah. The night of Bara'ah is the night between the 14th and 15th day of Sha'ban

Bara'ah means freedom from the fire of Jahannam (Hell). On the night of Bara'ah (15th night of Sha'ban) Allah Ta'ala frees large number of people from Jahannam and forgives those who repent and asks for forgiveness.

On the night of Bara'ah (15th night of Sha'ban) the mercy and forgiveness from Allah Ta'ala begins to shower down, right from the beginning of the night and continues right up until dawn.

On all other nights Allah Ta'ala's special mercy comes down during the last part of the night

Therefore, every Muslim should value this night, repent and ask forgiveness from The most Merciful Allah.

Every Muslim should ask forgiveness from Allah Ta'ala for himself, his family and all the Muslims, who are living and who have passed away.


