What the Record Shows: The application was filed on March 8, 2021, by Steven Johnson (me), as an Intent-to-Use service mark for martial arts instruction (Class 41). It proceeded initially, but on January 25, 2022, it was terminated after sanctions—indicating serious procedural or ethical issues, likely related to how the application was handled. The site uspto.report marked it as a Dead Application and dismissed or invalidated. Justia's page still lists "Pending Petition/Court Decision," but that is outdated given the termination record. (See serial numbers 90566158 — name; 90567409 — logo). I'm simply re-applying for the same, but this time I am not using any third-party entities. I am providing numerous documents to demonstrate that I've had prior use and a continuation of the NKJF name and logo.
