

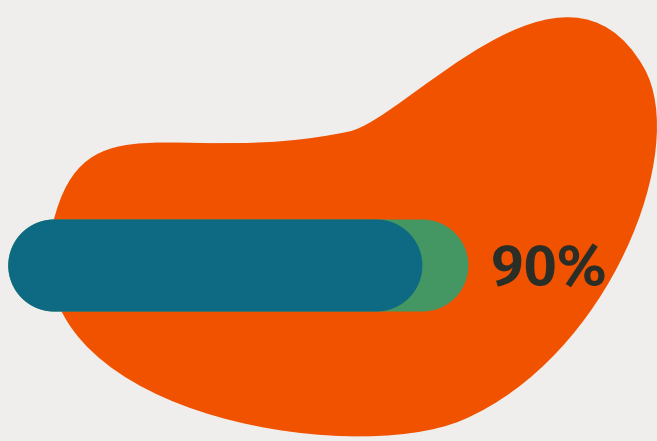
ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE LEADERS PROGRAM FOR TERTIARY STUDENTS IN AFRICA (AMRLEP)

Webinar series evaluation

ReAct (Action on Antibiotic Resistance) Africa and Students Against Superbugs-Africa with Data Action Impact ran a series of four weekly webinars to equip AMR champions with the tools, skills, and strategies to develop high impact initiatives to tackle antimicrobial resistance. Topics included problem framing, data collection & analysis, theory of change and impact measurement.

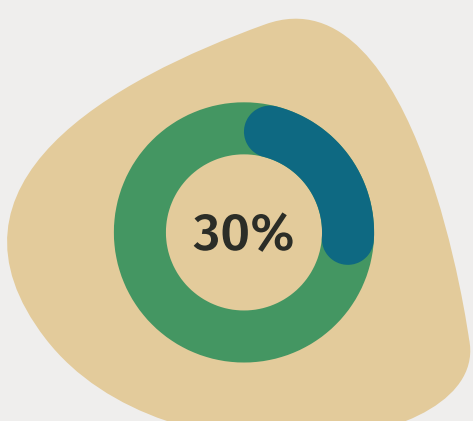
30 completed the program

100 attended at least one webinar. The participants were from Kenya, Uganda, Nigeria, Tanzania, Zimbabwe and Zambia



90% are now likely to start an AMR project in the next 6 months

Before the workshop, 60% were likely to start an AMR project in the next 6 months. The number one reason preventing them was not knowing where to start.



30% improvement in knowing how to start a project

44% didnt know where to start before the webinar series This dropped to just 14% after the workshop series.



Most reported their understanding & capability improved

More than 90% reported an improvement in their understanding and capability in the five workshop outcomes
