- 1. Please provide applicant's full name, mailing address, email address and phone number.
- 2. A typed essay on your experiences of living in Bondurant, and/or your contributions to the Bondurant community. An applicant must be able to present their strong ties to Bondurant and elaborate on their history and involvement with the community. A minimum of 500 words is required.
- 3. Provide the dates of when you lived in Bondurant and from what school(s) you graduated.
- 4. Please explain how you intend to use the education grant.
- 5. Please provide the address and phone number for the admissions office of the school you currently attend.
- 6. Please provide proof of your enrollment in college or a trade School.

Re-applying 2nd -4th year grant application:

- 1. Please provide applicant's full name, mailing address, email address and phone number.
- 2. A brief typed essay on your experiences with higher education is required.
- 3. Please provide the address and phone number for the admissions office of the school you currently attend.
- 4. Please provide proof of your enrollment in college or a trade School.

Applicant Requirements

- 1. Applicant must have graduated from a high school within Teton County or Sublette County.
- 2. Applicant must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the U.S.
- 3. Applicant must be a high school senior or earning their General Education Diploma ("GED"), unless the applicant entered the United States armed services or missionary work and is immediately enrolling in school after service.
