

TLIF0005 – Apply a fatigue risk management system

OVERVIEW

This unit equips heavy vehicle drivers with the skills and knowledge to apply a fatigue risk management system in the road transport sector. It is required for National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) Fatigue Management Accreditation and supports compliance with regulatory obligations for managing driver fatigue.

COURSE CONTENT

Learners will develop the ability to:

- Identify and manage fatigue risk in the road transport sector
- Operate within a road transport fatigue risk management system
- Plan and navigate heavy vehicle trips
- Comply with work and rest hour requirements
- Update and maintain records
