HOPEWELL MUSIC **STUDENTS AND FAMILIES**

During 2021, finding ways of staying connected was essential. Northside Program Enrollment



Hopewell Music has a strong connection to the Northside community, with the majority of students being from North Minneapolis and the immediate suburbs. Our students came from a variety of age ranges and backgrounds, with 38% of students who responded to voluntary surveys reporting as BIPOC and 31 being adult students. We are committed to centering equity, inclusivity, and accessibility in our programs to ensure that everyone feels welcome and has the resources and support they need to thrive. Hopewell will continue to partner with and listen to the community to offer programs that meet the needs of the students.

HOPEWELL MUSIC ABOUT OUR PROGRAMS

With over 300 lessons, 4 lesson recitals, and 6 ensemble concerts given, everyone exhibited incredible patience and dedication while continuing to navigate pandemic protocols. Virtual lessons and concerts played a key role. Improved technology access made it possible for students to stay connected with teachers and provide a sense of structure. With the help of social media, their music and creativity served as a way to bring a sense of community and celebrate accomplishments.

Hopewell Music provided over \$48K in student scholarships, with a majority of student receiving either full or partial scholarships. Easing the financial burden of music lessons ensures that our programs are truly inclusive and accessible to everyone in North Minneapolis.

With over 650 donations, grants and gifts, Hopewell provided exceptional music education and access to music We remain committed to being responsible stewards of the generosity given to Hopewell and to building a sustainable and healthy financial future.
