First Mention of Trumpets-YHVH's Covenant Call

There shall not an hand touch it, but he shall surely be stoned, or shot through; whether it be beast or man, it shall not live: when the <u>trumpet</u> soundeth long, <u>they shall come up to the mount</u>.

And it came to pass <u>on the third day in the morning</u>, that there were <u>thunders</u> and <u>lightnings</u>, and a <u>thick cloud upon the mount</u>, and the voice of the <u>trumpet exceeding loud</u>; so that all the people that was in the camp <u>trembled</u>.

And when the voice of the <u>trumpet</u> sounded long, and waxed louder and louder, Moses spake, and God answered him by a voice.

And all the people saw the thunderings, and the lightnings, and the <u>noise of the trumpet</u>, and the mountain smoking: and <u>when the people saw it, they removed</u>, and stood afar off.

Exodus 19:11; 13; 16; 19; 20:18

Scripture in Context

In the third month, when the children of Israel were gone forth out of the land of Egypt, the same day came they into the wilderness of Sinai.

For they were departed from Rephidim, and were come to the desert of Sinai, and had pitched in the wilderness; and there Israel camped before the mount.

And Moses went up unto God, and the Lord called unto him out of the mountain, saying, Thus shalt thou say to the house of Jacob, and tell the children of Israel;

Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself.

Now therefore, *if* ye will *obey my voice* indeed, and *keep my covenant*, then ye shall be a *peculiar treasure* unto me *above all people*: for *all the earth is mine*:

And ye shall be unto me a *kingdom of priests*, and an *holy nation*. These are the words which thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel.

And Moses came and called for the elders of the people and laid before their faces all these words which the Lord commanded him.

And all the people answered together, and said, All that the Lord hath spoken we will do. And Moses returned the words of the people unto the Lord.

And the Lord said unto Moses, Lo, I come unto thee in a thick cloud, that the people may hear when I speak with thee and believe thee forever. And Moses told the words of the people unto the Lord.

And the Lord said unto Moses, Go unto the people, and sanctify them today and tomorrow, and let them wash their clothes, And be ready against the third day: for the third day the Lord will come down in the sight of all the people upon mount Sinai.

And thou shalt set bounds unto the people round about, saying, Take heed to yourselves, that ye go not up into the mount, or touch the border of it: whosoever toucheth the mount shall be surely put to death:

There shall not an hand touch it, but he shall surely be stoned, or shot through; whether it be beast or man, it shall not live: when the trumpet soundeth long, they shall come up to the mount.

And Moses went down from the mount unto the people and sanctified the people; and they washed their clothes.

And he said unto the people, Be ready against the third day: come not at your wives.

And it came to pass on the third day in the morning, that there were thunders and lightnings, and a thick cloud upon the mount, and the voice of the trumpet exceeding loud; so that all the people that was in the camp trembled.

And Moses brought forth the people out of the camp to meet with God; and they stood at the nether part of the mount.

And mount Sinai was altogether on a smoke because the Lord descended upon it in fire: and the smoke thereof ascended as the smoke of a furnace, and the whole mount quaked greatly.

And when the voice of the trumpet sounded long, and waxed louder and louder, Moses spake, and God answered him by a voice.

And the Lord came down upon mount Sinai, on the top of the mount: and the Lord called Moses up to the top of the mount; and Moses went up.

And the Lord said unto Moses, Go down, charge the people, lest they break through unto the Lord to gaze, and many of them perish.

And let the priests also, which come near to the Lord, sanctify themselves, lest the Lord break forth upon them.

And Moses said unto the Lord, The people cannot come up to mount Sinai: for thou chargedst us, saying, Set bounds about the mount, and sanctify it.

And the Lord said unto him, Away, get thee down, and thou shalt come up, thou, and Aaron with thee: but let not the priests and the people break through to come up unto the Lord, lest he break forth upon them.

So Moses went down unto the people, and spake unto them. Exodus 19:1-25

Thoughts-Trumpet Call of YHVH-Announcing the Covenant

- The One True Almighty Creator God proposed a covenant with His people whom He delivered with a mighty hand <u>to be</u> unto Him a Peculiar Treasure, above all Nations, Kingdom of Priest, Holy Nation full of blessings and promises IF:
- <u>Covenant</u>: IF His people will readily hear AND obey Him as He instructs them on His Kingdom Covenant, He would be their God (v.4-6)
- > The people enter into God's covenant in agreement (v. 8-9)
- God comes to speak directly to His Treasure, Priests and set apart Nation of people so His People will Hear and Believe Him Forever
- First Trumpet: The Trumpet Call of God coming from the top of the mount, calling His people to come to the Mount to hear the Terms of His Kingdom Covenant which they agreed to enter.
- > Response to God's Trumpet: people trembled exceedingly and removed a far off

Terms of the Covenant

¹ And God spake all these words, saying,

² I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.

³ Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

⁴ Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth.

⁵ Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me;

⁶ And shewing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.

⁷ Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain.

⁸ Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.

⁹ Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work:

¹⁰ But the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates:

¹¹ For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it.

¹² Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee.

¹³ Thou shalt not kill.

¹⁴ Thou shalt not commit adultery.

¹⁵ Thou shalt not steal.

¹⁶ Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

¹⁷ Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that is thy neighbour's.

¹⁸ And all the people saw the thunderings, and the lightnings, and the noise of the trumpet, and the mountain smoking: and when the people saw it, they removed, and stood afar off.

¹⁹ And they said unto Moses, <u>Speak thou with us, and we will hear: but let not God speak with</u> <u>us, lest we die</u>.

²⁰ And Moses said unto the people, *Fear not: for God is come to prove you, and that his fear may be before your faces, that ye sin not.*

²¹ And the people stood afar off, and Moses drew near unto the thick darkness where God was.

Exodus 20:1-21

Response to the Trumpet Call of YHVH

- After experiencing Almighty YHVH announce the Terms of His Kingdom Covenant, the people asked Moses to speak for God to them due to their great fear and trembling.
- Moses challenged the people not to fear, but to embrace God's testing so that "ye sin not."
- What is sin? Transgressions against the terms of God's Kingdom Covenant (1 John 3:4) Remember, the people agreed to: "*all* the LORD says, we will do."
- > YHVH said to do a lot more than these Ten Commandments
- > The people did not wish to hear the judgements, ordinances, etc. from YHVH directly.
- > Moses relayed the rest of the terms of YHVH's Kingdom Covenant

Sabbath Memorial-Holy Convocation of blowing Trumpets

And the Lord spake unto Moses, saying,

Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, Concerning <u>the feasts of the Lord</u>, which ye shall proclaim to be holy convocations, <u>even these are *my feasts*</u>.

Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, In the <u>seventh month</u>, in the first day of the month, <u>shall ye have a sabbath</u>, a memorial of blowing of trumpets, an holy convocation.

Ye shall do no servile work therein: but ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the Lord.

Leviticus 23:1-2; 24-25

And in the <u>seventh month</u>, on the <u>first day</u> of the month, ye shall have an holy convocation; ye shall do no servile work: <u>it is a day of blowing the trumpets</u> unto you.

Numbers 29:1

YHVH's Feasts: For His people to Memorialize forever throughout their generations as a sign and witness to Whom we Belong: Kingdom Covenant

Trumpets Perpetual Ordinances

¹ And the Lord spake unto Moses, saying,

² <u>Make thee two trumpets of silver</u>; of a whole piece shalt thou make them: that thou mayest <u>use them for the calling of the assembly</u>, and for the <u>journeying</u> of the camps.

³ And <u>when they shall blow with them, all the assembly shall assemble</u> themselves to thee at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.

⁴ And if they blow but with <u>one trumpet</u>, then <u>the princes</u>, which are heads of the thousands of Israel, shall gather themselves unto thee.

⁵ When ye blow an alarm, then the <u>camps</u> that lie on the <u>east</u> parts shall go forward.

⁶ When ye blow an alarm the <u>second time</u>, then the camps that lie on the <u>south</u> side shall take their journey: they shall blow an alarm for their journeys.

⁷ But when the congregation is to be gathered together, ye shall blow, but ye shall not sound an alarm.

⁸ And the sons of Aaron, the <u>priests, shall blow with the trumpets; and they shall be to you for</u> <u>an ordinance forever throughout your generations</u>.

⁹ And if ye <u>go to war</u> in your land <u>against the enemy that oppresseth you</u>, then ye shall <u>blow an</u> <u>alarm with the trumpets</u>; and ye shall be remembered before the Lord your God, and ye shall be saved from your enemies.

¹⁰ Also <u>in the day of your gladness</u>, and <u>in your solemn days</u>, and in the <u>beginnings of your</u> <u>months</u>, <u>ye shall blow with the trumpets</u> over your burnt offerings, and over the sacrifices of your peace offerings; <u>that they may be to you for a memorial before your God</u>: I am the Lord your God.

Numbers 10:1-10

- To Call the Assembly
- Call to War Against Oppressive Enemy
- Days of gladness
- > Solemn days
- > At the beginning of months

Trumpet Call to War

And Moses <u>sent them to the war</u>, a thousand of every tribe, them and Phinehas the son of Eleazar the priest, to the war, with the holy instruments, and the <u>trumpets to blow</u> in his hand.

Numbers 31:6

Now Jericho was straitly shut up because of the children of Israel: none went out, and none came in.

And the Lord said unto Joshua, See, I have given into thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valour.

And ye shall compass the city, all ye men of war, and go round about the city once. Thus shalt thou do six days.

And seven priests shall bear before the ark seven trumpets of rams' horns: and the seventh day ye shall compass the city seven times, and the priests shall blow with the trumpets.

And it shall come to pass, that when they make a long blast with the ram's horn, and when ye hear the sound of the trumpet, all the people shall shout with a great shout; and the wall of the city shall fall down flat, and the people shall ascend up every man straight before him

Joshua 6:1-5

So the people shouted when the priests blew with the trumpets: and it came to pass, when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat, so that the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city. And they utterly destroyed all that was in the city, both man and woman, young and old, and ox, and sheep, and ass, with the edge of the sword.

Joshua 6:20-21

And the Lord said unto Gideon, By the three hundred men that lapped will I save you and deliver the Midianites into thine hand: and let all the other people go every man unto his place.

And he said unto them, Look on me, and do likewise: and, behold, when I come to the outside of the camp, it shall be that, as I do, so shall ye do.

When I blow with a trumpet, I and all that are with me, then blow ye the trumpets also on every side of all the camp, and say, The sword of the Lord, and of Gideon.

Judges 7:7; 17-18

Trumpet Call Announcing the King

And when thou comest thither, look out there Jehu the son of Jehoshaphat the son of Nimshi, and go in, and make him arise up from among his brethren, and carry him to an inner chamber;

Then take the box of oil, and pour it on his head, and say, Thus saith the Lord, I have anointed thee king over Israel. Then open the door, and flee, and tarry not.

Then they hasted, and took every man his garment, and put it under him on the top of the stairs, and blew with trumpets, saying, Jehu is king.

2 Kings 9:2-3; 13

And to the captains over hundreds did the priest give king David's spears and shields, that were in the temple of the LORD.

And the guard stood, every man with his weapons in his hand, round about the king, from the right corner of the temple to the left corner of the temple, along by the altar and the temple.

And he brought forth the king's son, and put the crown upon him, and gave him the testimony; and they made him king, and anointed him; and they clapped their hands, and said, God save the king.

And when Athaliah (unrighteous ruler) heard the noise of the guard and of the people, she came to the people into the temple of the LORD.

And when she looked, behold, the king stood by a pillar, as the manner was, and the princes and <u>the trumpeters by the king</u>, and all the people of the land rejoiced, <u>and blew with</u> <u>trumpets</u>:

2 Kings 11:10-14a

Trumpet Announces Ark of Covenant Return

And let us bring again the ark of our God to us: for we enquired not at it in the days of Saul.

And they carried the ark of God in a new cart out of the house of Abinadab: and Uzza and Ahio drave the cart.

And David and all Israel played before God with all their might, and with singing, and with harps, and with psalteries, and with timbrels, and with cymbals, and with trumpets.

1 Chronicles 13:3; 7-8

Make a Joyful Noise for YHVH's Salvation

O sing unto the LORD a new song; for he hath done marvellous things: his right hand, and his holy arm, hath gotten him the victory.

The LORD hath made known his salvation: his righteousness hath he openly shewed in the sight of the heathen.

He hath remembered his mercy and his truth toward the house of Israel: all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all the earth: make a loud noise, and rejoice, and sing praise.

Sing unto the LORD with the harp; with the harp, and the voice of a psalm.

With trumpets and sound of cornet make a joyful noise before the LORD, the King.

Psalm 98:1-6

Coming Trumpets

In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, <u>at the last trump</u>: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

1 Corinthians 15:52

For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep.

For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:

Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.

Wherefore comfort one another with these words.

1 Thessalonians 4:15-18

¹ And when he had opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven about the space of half an hour.

⁶ And the seven angels which had the seven trumpets prepared themselves to sound.

⁷ The <u>first angel sounded</u>, and there followed <u>hail and fire mingled with blood</u>, and they were <u>cast upon the earth</u>: and the third part of trees was burnt up, and all green grass was burnt up.

⁸ And the <u>second angel sounded</u>, and as it were a <u>great mountain burning with fire was cast into</u> <u>the sea</u>: and the third part of the sea became blood;

⁹ And the third part of the creatures which were in the sea, and had life, died; and the third part of the ships were destroyed.

¹⁰ And the <u>third angel sounded</u>, and there <u>fell a great star from heaven</u>, <u>burning</u> as it were a lamp, and it fell upon the third part of the <u>rivers</u>, and upon the <u>fountains</u> of waters;

¹¹ And the name of the star is called Wormwood: and the third part of the waters became wormwood; and many men died of the waters, because they were made bitter.

¹² And the <u>fourth angel sounded</u>, and the third part of the <u>sun</u> was smitten, and the third part of the <u>moon</u>, and the third part of the <u>stars</u>; so as the third part of them was <u>darkened</u>, and the day shone not for a third part of it, and the night likewise.

¹³ And I beheld, and heard an angel flying through the midst of heaven, saying with a loud voice, <u>Woe, woe, woe</u>, to the inhabiters of the earth <u>by reason of the other voices of the trumpet of</u> <u>the three angels, which are yet to sound</u>!

Revelation 8:1; 6-13

And the <u>fifth angel sounded</u>, and I saw a star fall from heaven unto the earth: and to him was given the <u>key of the bottomless pit</u>.

And the <u>sixth angel sounded</u>, and I heard a voice from the four horns of the golden altar which is before God, <u>Saying to the sixth angel which had the trumpet</u>, <u>Loose the four angels</u> which are bound in the great river Euphrates. Revelation 9:1; 13-14

But in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he shall begin to sound, the mystery of God should be finished, as he hath declared to his servants the prophets.

Revelation 10:7

And the <u>seventh angel sounded</u>; and there were <u>great voices in heaven, saying, The kingdoms</u> of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign for ever <u>and ever</u>.

And the temple of God was opened in heaven, and there was seen in his temple the ark of his testament: and there were lightnings, and voices, and thunderings, and an earthquake, and great hail.

Revelation 11:15; 19

NOTE: Similar to when the covenant was first announced.

- Coming Trumpets: 7 Seals precedes 7 trumpets
 - At the Last Trumpet, YHVH returns-Resurrection Time
 - \circ $\;$ The Mystery of God is finished as He declared to His Prophets.
- ➤ The Last/7th Trumpet Announces:
 - The kingdom of the world BECOMING The Kingdom of our LORD God and His Christ who will reign forever and ever
 - The Temple of God opening, revealing the Ark of His Covenant
