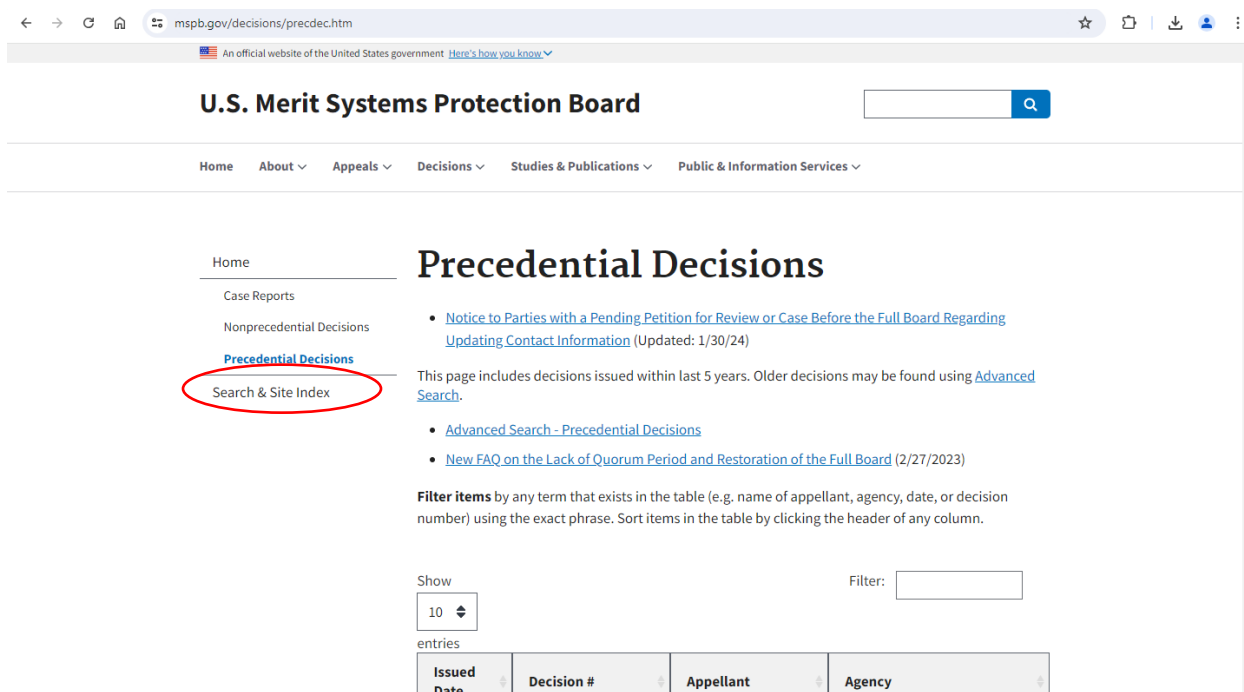


**MSPB** – click on link “Decisions” at top and then select any of the three options: case reports, nonprecedential decisions, or precedential decisions.

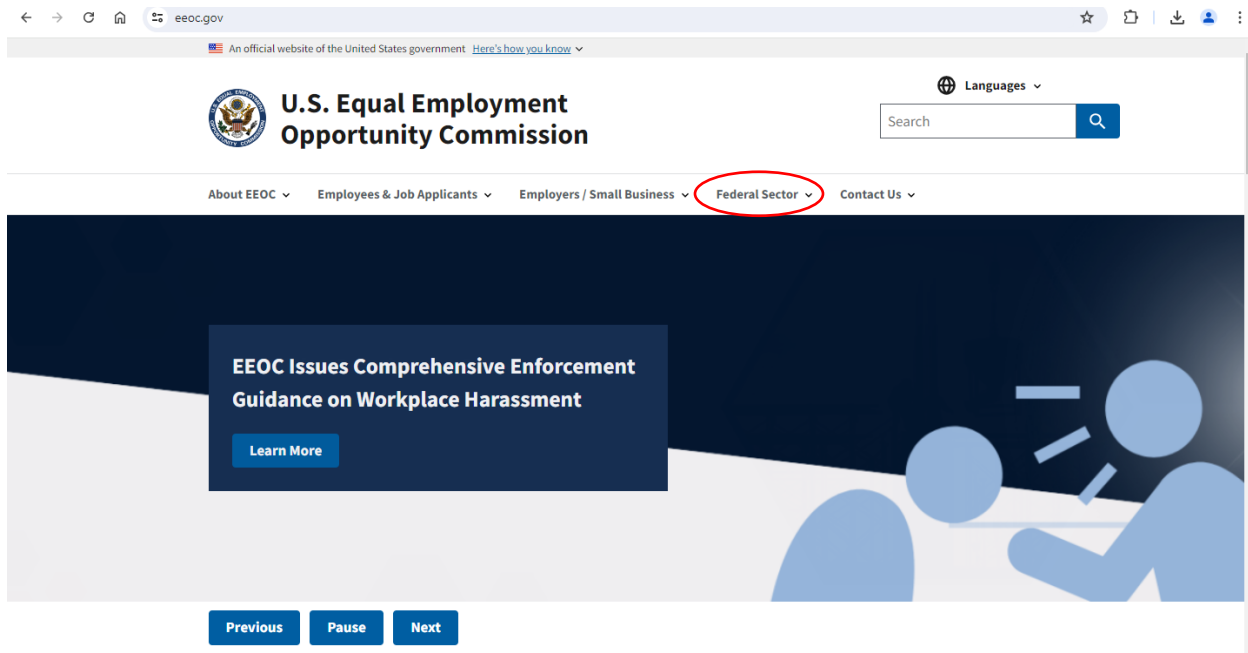

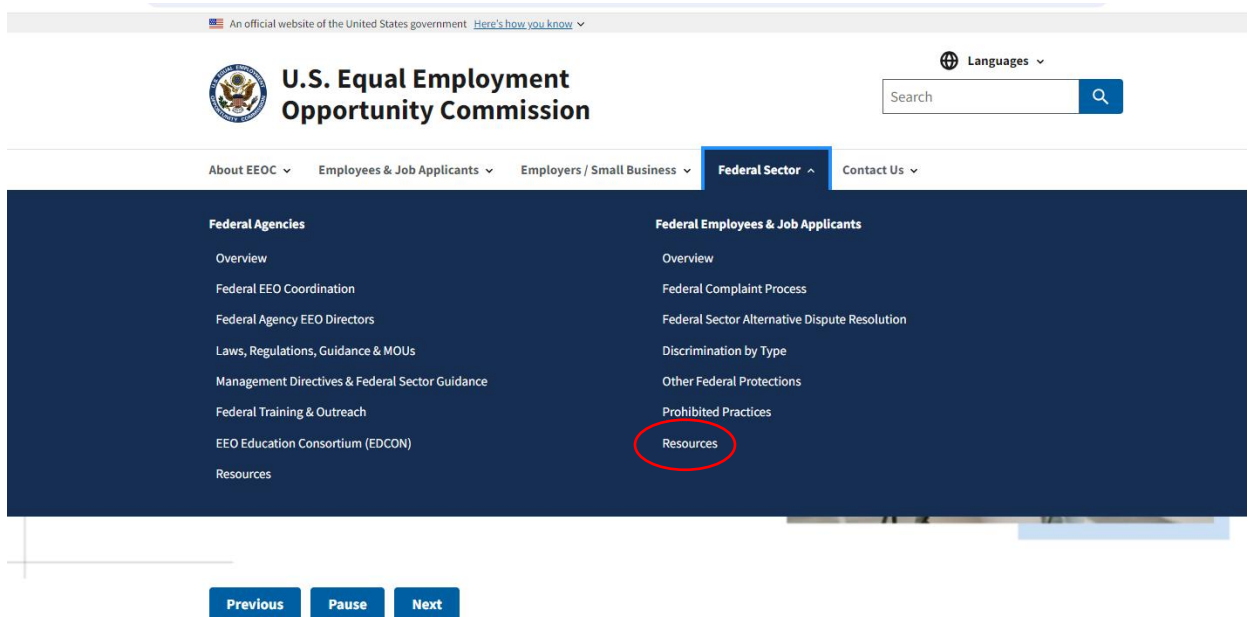
