



# Cake Transportation Guide

Moving a celebration, novelty, or tiered cake from one location to another does not have to be complicated. It can be easy!

If you follow these simple guidelines, you will ensure that your cake will arrive safely—whether you are travelling hundreds of miles or just a few.

1. Thoroughly read the cake transportation instructions by Razzmatazz Cakes. Upon collection we will ask you to sign a disclaimer confirming you have read and understood these guidelines.
2. Make sure the vehicle is clean and free of unnecessary items. You don't want anything to fall onto or bump the cake, let alone get unwanted fluff and lint on your celebratory centrepiece.
3. Give yourself enough time. You will want to drive slowly to minimise the chance of any mishaps.
4. If your cake is for a summer event, you may want to take extra precautions. Have your car/mini-van sitting in the shade and start the air conditioner before the cakes are moved.
5. Ask for help loading the cake(s). It can be a good idea to rope a friend or relative into helping you with your cake collection, especially if it is a large cake, as it can be a little tricky trying to open a car door while balancing a 3-tier celebration cake!

6. Never keep the cake box on the vehicle's seat while transporting. The seats are not level, and there is a chance of the packages shifting, thus ruining the cake inside. Put the box/boxes on a foam mat, which you place on a flat surface. This way, the box and the cake inside will not shift during transportation.
7. If you can remove a seat easily, do that. Alternatively, arrange one or both blankets over the backseat to level the surface on which the cake will rest. You can complete this step using either the front passenger seat or the floor behind the front passenger seat.
8. From here, the most important thing to do is drive your vehicle slowly and safely on the speed limit or a couple of miles an hour under it, taking care like you've two dozen eggs and newborn triplets on board! Take extra care when making turns or entering driveways and avoid sudden jerks or brakes, or your cake will be damaged. To prevent the cake from sudden jerks, place the cake on non-slip foam matting. These mats can prevent your cakes from moving because of your vehicle movements.
9. Don't make unnecessary stops on your way to the event/celebration. This only increases the likelihood that something could happen to the cake.
