As we enter the final quarter of the year, we'll continue to build on this momentum. We'll introduce new programs, host exciting events, and maintain our commitment to excellence.




POLITICAL

Cyril Ramaphosa has been re-elected as South Africa's president for a second term after his party struck a last-minute deal with political rivals.

Ramaphosa's African National Congress, which came to power in 1994 after waging a decades-long battle against apartheid, lost its majority for the first time in an election last month and spent two weeks locked in intensive behind-the-scenes talks with other parties.

SCIENCE

The global Artemis program is a NASA-led international space exploration program that aims to land the first woman and the first person of color on the Moon by 2025 as part of the long-term goal of establishing a sustainable human presence on the Moon. Additionally, the NASA mission called Europa Clipper, scheduled for a 2024 launch, will orbit around Jupiter and fly by Europa, one of Jupiter's moons, to study the presence of water and its habitability.



PALESTINE ART EXHIBITION:



STUDY TIPS FOR FINAL EXAMS





- 1. Get Organized: Carry a homework planner at all times. Write down assignments, projects, tests and assignments as soon as they are assigned. This helps to ensure that you don't forget important tasks.
- 2. Pay Attention in Class: Concentrate during class and avoid distractions. Practice active listening by taking notes in your own words. Understanding what's being taught in class is crucial for effective studying.
- 3. Steer Clear of Distractions: Identify distractions (such as cell phones, social media, or friends) and avoid them. Consider sitting away from distracting friends and turning off your cell phone to stay focused.
- 4. Make Sure Notes Are Complete: Take clear and complete notes during class. These notes will serve as study material that can be used for review before tests.
- 5. Ask Questions If You Don't Understand: Don't hesitate to raise your hand and ask questions if something isn't clear. If you're uncomfortable asking in front of everyone, make a note to talk to the teacher after class.
