The NDSGS Workshop is April 11, 2015 from noon to 4:30 pm. Registration will be outside the Russell Reid Auditorium in the Heritage Center, Bismarck.

Dr. Igor Ovchinnikov, associate professor at University of North Dakota, is the keynote speaker and will present information on the North Dakota Genetic

Ancestry Project that he is conducting. His lecture will include the following topics:

- North Dakota Genetic Ancestry Project (also known as Genetic structure of ethnic groups of European ancestry in North Dakota)
- Comparison of the ancestry testing industry and the population genetic studies
- Why North Dakota residents with European history?
- Why do we need to know population structure caused by ancestry and immigration history?
- Genetic markers and tests used in the population genetics and the genealogical studies, mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) and Y chromosome
- Genetic consequences of immigration

from well-defined source populations in Europe

- Interpretation of ancestry in North Dakota by mitochondrial DNA variation
- Linkage between population genetics and genealogical studies

Dr. Ovchinnikov will also be collecting

saliva buccal swabs from volunteers for testing the genetic variation among North Dakota residents.

Tourism Coordinator, will speak on Native American History.


Greg Wysk with the State Historical Society

Citation Corner

Many of our ancestors came from other countries. Naturalization records can be full of information particularly if they immigrated after 1906. This is when the longer form was first used and can be several pages long. The earlier forms may list the name, what country they came from and approximately when and where they immigrated to such as New York.

Some naturalization records are online and some are accessed at the state or federal record levels. Familysearch has some naturalization records and indexes online and ancestry.com also has some indexes and records online.

A statewide index is available online for North Dakota. According to the State Historical Society of North Dakota website: The index is complete for all of the state's 53 counties and contains more than 212,000 entries. The index includes name, country of emigration, date of declaration of intention (first papers) or date of naturalization (second papers), the county where the proceedings occurred, and volume and page information for locating the record. More information is available on their website.
