

WCGS LOOKING FOR OBITS

Snow-laden juniper shrubs sprawling around the cast- iron cemetery gate provide temporary refuge for a jack rabbit. Pink remnants of red plastic roses lie drowning in wind-driven white drift. A lonely tumbleweed bumps inquisitively against the cold shoulder of a limestone grave marker, then goes careening off across the barren prairie.

Cemeteries, more silent than ever in winter, wait with timeless patience the coming of spring and wandering visitors. Last summer, those visitors included members of the Williams County Genealogical Society as they gathered gravesite information for the Cemetery Records Index, the compilation of which is the current goal of the group.

The above introduced an article written for the Williston Daily Herald as the WCGS sought to obtain obituaries from local sources -- cemetery associations, caretakers, relatives, obituary-clippers; anyone who might help in collecting information about burials in Williams County, is being recruited in the project.

The ultimate goal is a Williams County Cemetery Records Index to assist researchers in their work. It is projected that data collection will continue through the next summer; data entry will follow. Currently, an off-shoot of this project is the compilation of collected obituaries into alphabetized notebooks. Anyone with material to contribute may contact me @ (701) 572-7829
