Citation Corner

Information from genetic reports and DNA match lists are being used by researchers as genealogical evidence. Traditional documentary evidence must accompany the DNA evidence to solve genealogical problems. But how do we report the genetic information?

Genetic testing companies provide match lists for their customers. Examples for citing a result from these lists might be:

"Chromosome Browser," database, FamilyTreeDNA (https://www.familytreedna.com : accessed 23 February 2018), P.D. Brown and Lori Smith, Chromosome 2, (198822596-218362333), 19.72cM.

"AncestryDNA results for William Smith," personalized database, *AncestryDNA* (https://www.ancestry.com/dna : accessed 23 February 2018), predicting "4th-6th cousin" genetic match with user "V.H." at "Extremely High" confidence level. "V.H." offers only an undocumented

"tree" whose assertions need to be proved with valid evidence before genetic data can be properly interpreted.

Many of us use the GEDmatch website to compare DNA results from multiple companies. An example for citing results from this database might be:

GEDmatch, "One-to-one' compare," database V2.1.1(c), GEDmatch (https://www.gedmatch.com : downloaded 23 February 2018), kit nos. T123456 and A123456, 3 segments totaling 70.2cM above 7cM – particularly chromosome 5 (109327461-148785244), 36.8cM.

I have changed the names and numbers in these examples. Similar to obtaining permission to publish copyrighted information one must always get permission from the matches to publish any findings.
